

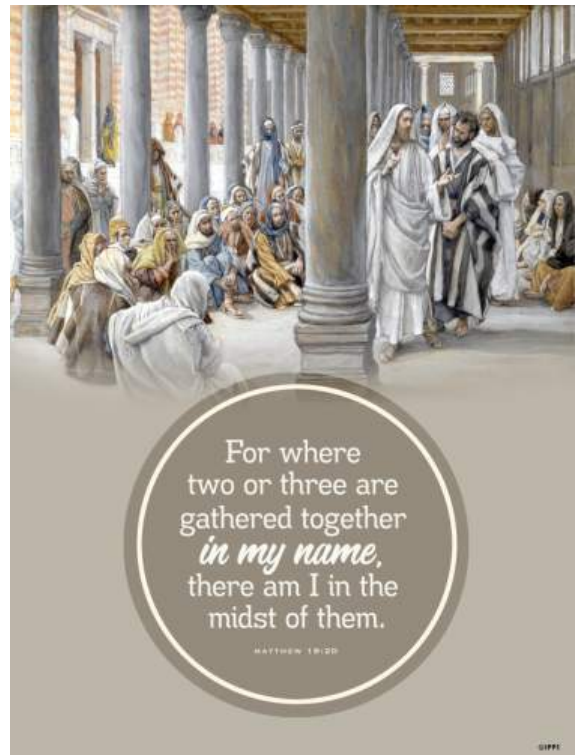

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus lays out for his disciples a quite logical and compassionate way of dealing with sinful behavior. I first approach the person one-on-one. If that conversation fails, I bring along two or three people with me and try it again. If that second method fails, then I bring the straying person before the church. Expelling someone from the community would be the last resort. Other texts in the New Testament make clear that expulsion or excommunication is done only for the purpose of helping the person acknowledge the error of his or her ways and facilitate a return to the community.

The first century, however, did not have social media with which to contend. At least for the situations that make the news, it seems our Western culture has largely reversed the order of Jesus' command. Nowadays if someone says or does something a person or group does not like, the offender gets called out on social media so his or her reputation is ruined or at least tarnished. Forget about the one-on-one or small group conversation that might help to heal the situation or bring reconciliation and greater understanding.

Many people of good will have been calling for less emotional drama in our world, courageous conversations, and more sincere attempts at mutual understanding. An admirable aim of the upcoming synod in October is Pope Francis' desire that we as a church witness to the world that we can walk together as brothers and sisters. If you find yourself in a situation like that described in Matthew 18, why not try Jesus' way?

BIULETYN Parafialny



Amerykański trapista Tomasz Merton wypowiedział kiedyś słynne zdanie: „Nikt nie jest samotną wyspą”. W ten sposób wyraził prawdę, że nie tylko żyjemy we wspólnocie, ale jesteśmy też za siebie nawzajem odpowiedzialni.

W pierwszym czytaniu Bóg przypomina prorokowi Ezechielowi, a także i każdemu z nas, że odpowiedzialność w imię miłości bliźniego nie polega na pobłażaniu, ale na napominaniu tych, którzy grzeszą. A jeśli – w imię źle rozumianej tolerancji – pozwolę sobie „przymknąć oko” i udawać, że sprawa mnie nie dotyczy, wtedy ponoszę współodpowiedzialność.

To przypomnienie o naszej odpowiedzialności za innych wynika z faktu, że Bogu bardzo zależy na każdym człowieku, ponieważ każdy został wykupiony z niewoli grzechu drogocenną Krwią Chrystusa. Jako wspólnota Kościoła pielgrzymującego po ziemi mamy przyjąć Bożą miłość. Ona czyni nas odpowiedzialnymi za naszych bliźnich. W tym duchu należy odczytywać obowiązek braterskiego upominania.

Celem upomnienia winno być pozyskanie bliźniego nie dla osobistej przyjaźni, ale dla wspólnoty, gdyby grzeszący brat był na drodze do jej opuszczenia. Nie chodzi w nim o wykazanie winy, o ukaranie, ale o odzyskanie brata, o pomoc człowiekowi. Po prostu o miłość. Upominam, bo mi na kimś zależy, czuję się za niego odpowiedzialny

Jakiego napominania uczy nas Pan Jezus? Pokazuje, że bliźnich, którzy grzeszą, trzeba upominać w sposób dyskretny i taktowny. Przekazywana prawda musi iść w parze z miłością, jak to czynił Jezus. Grzech zostaje zdemaskowany i potępiony, ale człowiek, który go popełnia, ma być zrozumiany, przyjęty i ochroniony. To wynika z miłości i odpowiedzialności. Jak więc upominać? Ewangelia mówi, że najpierw w cztery oczy, a gdy nie posłuchają, w obecności świadków. Natomiast w przypadku wyjątkowego uporu i trwania w złu – Jezus każe sprawę uczynić publiczną, aby cała wspólnota, przelożonym Kościoła, mogła upomnieć błądzącego brata. W przypadku nieposłuszeństwa, Kościół ma prawo wykluczyć takiego zatwardziałego grzesznika ze wspólnoty wierzących. Ale pokutującego może znowu dopuścić do udziału w życiu Kościoła.

Jednak najskuteczniejszym sposobem wykazania błędu są czyny, a nie słowa. Chodzi więc nie tyle o napominanie innych, wytykanie ich błędów, co o pokazanie, jak należy postępować. Takie argumenty są dużo bardziej skuteczniejsze, ale wymagają znacznie większego zaangażowania i wysiłku z naszej strony. Jednak, jeżeli chodzi o odzyskanie brata – żadna cena nie jest za wysoka. Bo „miarą miłości jest miłość bez miary”.

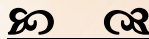

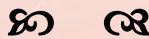
