

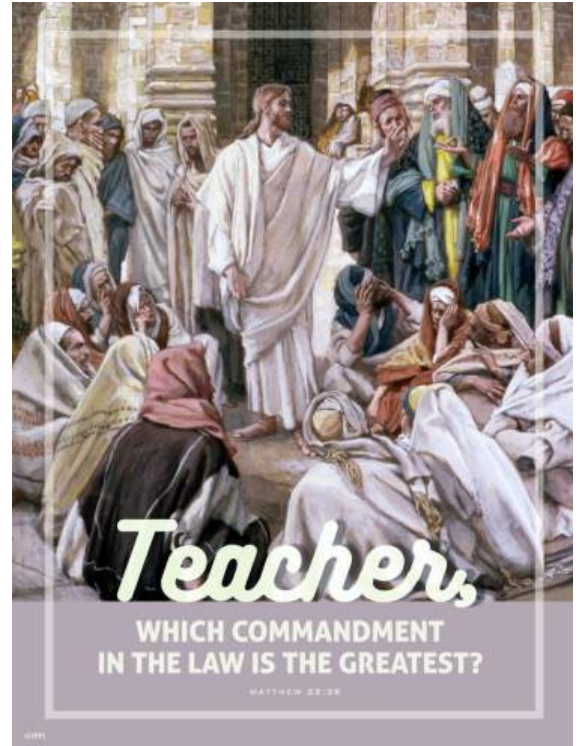

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! This week I almost did not write an exclamation point after the greeting because it might appear too lighthearted in the face of world events in the Middle East and Ukraine—not to mention the war, terrorism, and religious persecution that do not make the front page. However, I decided to keep the exclamation point as a challenge to all of us that lasting peace begins within human hearts as we learn to see each other as created in the image and likeness of God.

BIULETYN Parafialny

Wśród związków chemicznych, niezbędnych do prawidłowego funkcjonowania żywego organizmu, znajdują się witaminy. Gdy zabraknie jakiejś witaminy albo odpowiedniego środowiska dla danej witaminy, wtedy się jej nie przyswaja, a wręcz może zaszkodzić. Staje się trucizną. Tak dzieje się też również z brakiem miłości. Św. Jan Paweł II pokazywał w swoim nauczaniu, że miłość jest kluczem do zrozumienia człowieka i dlatego „człowiek nie może żyć bez miłości”. Można powiedzieć: teoretycznie brzmi pięknie. A praktyka życia codziennego pokazuje zupełnie inny obraz. Dlaczego? Ponieważ w naszym życiu jest wiele lęków, frustracji, niepowodzeń. I na pewno prawdziwej miłości nie zastąpią jakieś filmowe historie, których bajkowy koniec jest do przewidzenia. Słowo Boże głoszone ustami Jezusa z Nazaretu przypomina nam, że prawdziwa miłość istnieje, a człowiek potrafi kochać. Dzieje się tak, ponieważ „Bóg pierwszy nas umiłował”. I dał nam miłość jako przykazanie: „Będziesz miłował Pana Boga swego całym swoim sercem, całą swoją duszą i całym swoim umysłem” i „Będziesz miłował swego bliźniego jak siebie samego”.



Jezusowa odpowiedź dana w dzisiejszej Ewangelii uczonemu w Piśmie składa się z dwóch cytatów ze Starego Testamentu. Warto zapytać: co nowego pojawia się w nauczaniu Jezusa? Nowość polega na ścisłym połączeniu ze sobą miłości Boga i człowieka. W Starym Testamencie te przykazania występowały bowiem rozdzielnie. A dla Jezusa łączą się ze sobą i są najważniejsze. To znaczy, że prawdziwa i autentyczna miłość Boga jest niemożliwa bez miłości człowieka. Więcej, miłość wobec człowieka jest sprawdzianem miłości wobec Boga. Służba Bogu musi stawać się służbą człowiekowi.

POWIEDZ NIE samobójstwu wspomaganemu przez lekarzy w Massachusetts

Ustawodawcy stanu Massachusetts ponownie rozważają przyjęcie głęboko niepokojących ustaw, które zalegalizowałyby samobójstwo wspomagane przez lekarza. Projekty ustaw, House 2246 i Senat 1331, mają identyczny tekst i zatytułowane „Ustawa dotycząca opcji zakończenia życia”.

„Biskupi katolicki Massachusetts zdecydowanie wurażają sprzeciw wobec samobójstwa wspomaganego przez lekarza.

Oto kilka niepokojących faktów, które należy wziąć pod uwagę przed podjęciem działań:

1. Ustawy umożliwiłyby lekarzowi dostarczanie śmiertelnej mieszanki leków osobie, u której zdiagnozowano mniej niż 6 miesięcy życia, której spożycie spowodowałoby śmierć.

UWAGA – Diagnoza może być błędna. Niezliczona liczba osób przeżyła tę sześciomiesięczną diagnozę i cieszyła się wieloma cenniejszymi miesiącami i latami spędzonymi z rodziną i przyjaciółmi.

2. Brak rzeczywistych zabezpieczeń – bezbronna osoba, która jest niepełnosprawna fizycznie, przygnębiona lub boi się, że będzie „ciężarem”, może podlegać nadmiernemu wpływowi innych osób, aby zażyła mieszankę leków, szczególnie jeśli zachętą jest korzyść finansowa.

3. Wybrani urzędnicy powinni skupiać się przede wszystkim na ustawodawstwie zapewniającym wysokiej jakości opiekę zdrowotną, opiekę psychiatryczną i opiekę paliatywną chorym i umierającym – szczególnie w społecznościach niedostatecznie zaopatrzonych, biednych i mniejszościowych, które najbardziej cierpią w potrzebie.

Zadzwoń lub wyślij e-mail do swoich legislatorów, daj im znać, że jesteś wyborcą w Massachusetts i powiedz NIE samobójstwu wspomaganemu przez lekarza! Zaloguj się na stronie www.macatholic.org i skorzystaj z łączy, aby znaleźć informacje kontaktowe.

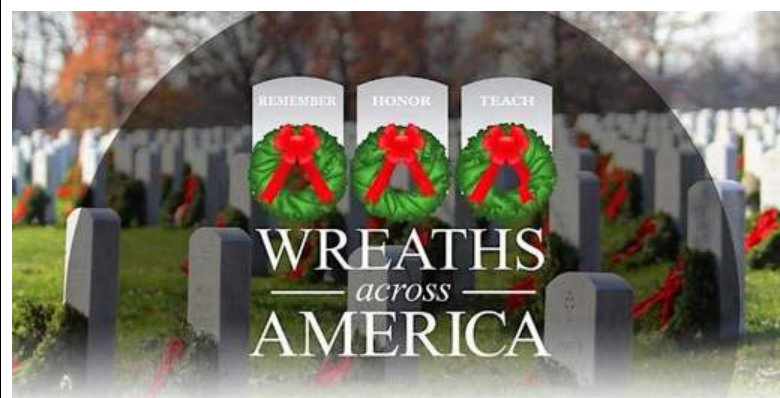

Say NO to Physician Assisted Suicide in Massachusetts

LET YOUR VOICE BE HEARD NOW!



The Massachusetts State Legislature is again considering passing into law two deeply troubling bills this session which would legalize Physician Assisted Suicide. The bills, House 2246 and Senate 1331, are identical in text and titled “*An Act relative to end of life options*”.

“The Catholic Bishops of Massachusetts stand united in our strong opposition to Physician Assisted Suicide. It is an affront to life and a dangerous precedent for determining end of life issues. Physicians are trained to care for the ill, not to hasten death.”¹

Here are some troubling facts to consider before you act:

- The bills would allow a physician to provide a deadly drug mixture to an individual diagnosed with less than 6 months to live that, when consumed, would cause death.
NOTE- The diagnosis could be wrong. Countless individuals have outlived that 6-month diagnosis and enjoyed many more precious months and years with family and friends.
- No Real Safeguards - A vulnerable individual who is physically disabled, depressed, or fears being a “burden” may be subject to undue influence by others to take the drug mixture, especially if there is a financial benefit as an incentive.
- The primary focus of elected officials should be dedicated to legislation providing quality health care, mental health care and palliative care to the sick and dying – particularly in the underserved, poor and minority communities that suffer the most at the time of need.

How can your voice be heard?
