Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy New Year! Peace and all good things! As we prepare to ring in 2024, the liturgy this Sunday challenges us to reflect on the family life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We often imagine that it must have been nice to live in a sinless family. What could go wrong? Well... Think about what it must be like to *always* follow the will of God. That is no easy task, especially when it flies in the face of what *we* want to do or what others expect of us. How can we live more faithfully the ideals of the Gospel and reflect God's loving design for human life? Do the members of my family seek to reconcile with each other and also look outward toward service of others and the wider community? What is one small step we could take today to resemble more and more the family life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph?

BIULETYN Parafialny

W dzisiejszą niedzielę nasze myśli biegną do Nazaretu, gdzie Jezus, Maryja i Józef dzielili los wielu współczesnych sobie rodzin. Tym, co stanowi dla nas przykład, jest miłość, która była w tej rodzinie na pierwszym miejscu. Kiedy patrzymy na Świętą Rodzinę, to przed oczyma stają nam rodziny, w których żyjemy. Przy okazji Świąt Bożego Narodzenia uświadamiamy sobie jeszcze bardziej ich ważną rolę w naszym życiu.

Małżeństwo, które jest sakramentalnym „przymierzem, przez które mężczyzna i kobieta tworzą ze sobą wspólnotę całego życia” (KKK 1601), stanowi fundament rodziny. Życie małżeńskie trzeba programować z Bogiem, a nie na własną rękę. Trzeba zapraszać Go do rodzinnego stołu, rodzinnych rozmów, decyzji, rodzinnej troski o każdego w domu. Z Nim trzeba pochylać się nad chorym, planować swój czas, niedzielę czy wypoczynek. Z Nim oglądać film, korzystać z Internetu, z Nim przyjmować gości. Z Nim przeżywać poczęcie i narodziny kolejnych dzieci i z Nim zamykać oczy tym, którzy udają się do domu Ojca. Jeżeli o tym się zapomina, jeśli nie dopuszcza się Boga do codziennego życia w rodzinie, to rodzina zawsze stanie się „duchową pustynią”.



Papież Benedykt nauczał, że „kto się modli, nie traci czasu, nawet jeśli wszystko wskazuje na potrzebę pilnej interwencji i skłania nas jedynie do działania” (DCE 36). Pochłonięcie aktywizmem może prowadzić do tego, że modlitwa utraci swój charakter chrześcijański i swoją prawdziwą skuteczność. Jeśli jednak dostrzeżemy jej wartość, może stać się fundamentem w budowaniu małżeństwa i rodziny.

MODLITWA RODZINY NA NOWY ROK

Miłosierny Boże, z Twojej łaskawości przeżyliśmy kolejny rok naszego życia. Dziękujemy za wszelkie dobro, jakie odebraliśmy z Twojej łaskawej ojcowskiej ręki. Stajemy przed Tobą w gronie naszej rodziny u progu nowego roku, aby wspólnie modlić się do Ciebie. Ten nowy rok jest jeszcze dla nas zagadką i tajemnicą. Ale choć nie wiemy, co nas w nim spotka, to patrzymy z ufnością w przyszłość, bo wierzymy, że Ty jesteś z nami, a z Tobą nic złego nie może nam się stać. Ty, miłujący Ojczy, wszystko wiesz, przenikasz nasze myśli, plany i działania, zanim jeszcze my sami je poznamy. Wiemy, że Ty pragniesz dla nas tylko dobra, choć to dobro nie zawsze zgadza się z tym, czego my oczekujemy. Daj nam, prosimy, tak współpracować w tym roku z Twoją łaską, abyśmy robili tylko to, co się Tobie podoba i co Ty dla nas przewidziałeś; abyśmy we wszystkim pełnili Twoją świętą wolę. Uchron nas przed układaniem swojego życia bez Ciebie. Nie wypuszczaj nas z Twoich ojcowskich rąk.

Oddajemy Ci wszystkie nasze plany i pragnienia na te nowe dni i prosimy, abyś Ty je ułożył po swojemu – tak aby były dla nas jak najlepsze. Miej w opiece każdego z nas i prowadź nas po wszystkich ścieżkach, którymi będziemy chodzić, aby nikt z nas nie zbłądził i abyśmy tymi ścieżkami doszli kiedyś do Twojego Królestwa, naszego prawdziwego Domu. Amen.

Dziękujemy Jej za to, że swą macierzyńską opieką nas otacza. **W Bazylice Górnej o godzinie 9.00 będzie odprawiona Msza św. w języku polskim**, a o 11.00 AM w języku angielskim. Nie ma spowiedzi ani adoracji zaplanowanej na ten dzień. Kancelaria Parafialna będzie nieczynna. Ponieważ Dzień Nowego Roku przypada w poniedziałek, 1 stycznia 2024 r. nie jest dniem w którym uczestnictwo we Mszy św. jest obowiązkowe.

Consider Leaving a Lasting Legacy

Qualified Charitable Distribution

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a tax-smart decision while increasing the impact of your support of St. Stanislaus Basilica by considering a transfer from your IRA.

Many of you may be familiar with the term “*Qualified Charitable Distribution*” or QCD. This is a distribution from your IRA paid directly to a charity.

If you are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can direct your IRA custodian to send a portion of your annual distribution up to \$100,000 to support St. Stanislaus Basilica.

Now, why would you want to do this?

The average standard deduction is much higher than it has been in the past and many taxpayers will find that they do not have enough to itemize. This means their gifts to St. Stanislaus Basilica will not count as a tax deduction.

If you are one of those people who can no longer itemize deductions and you write a check to St. Stanislaus Basilica, you will not get a tax deduction. But if you use the QCD option from your IRA, then you will directly reduce your income, save in taxes, and make a big impact on the future of St. Stanislaus Basilica and all its ministries.
