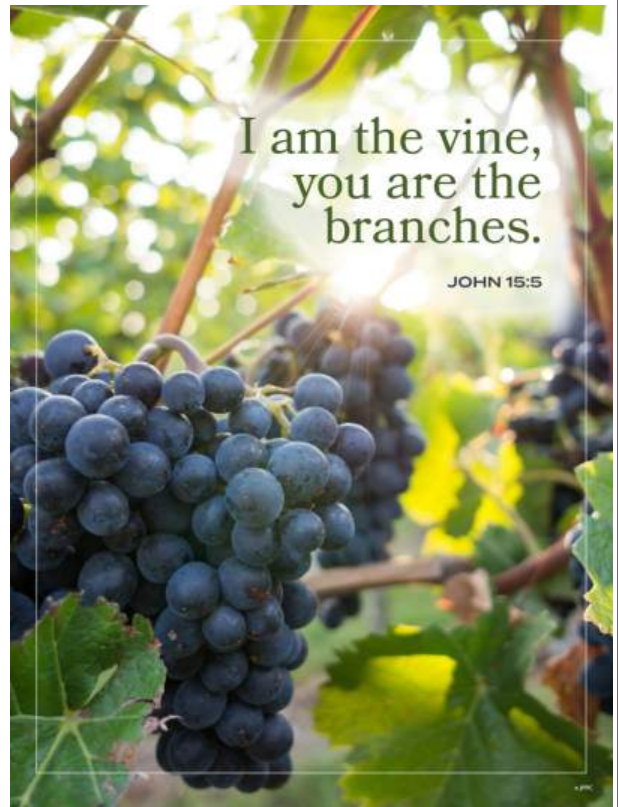

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Easter peace and all good things! “Are you a practicing Catholic?” This is the first question I must ask when someone whom I don’t know personally requests a certificate to be a godparent at Baptism or sponsor at Confirmation. Contrary to what many might think, I don’t look at the person’s contribution records but ask which Sunday Mass he or she attends. As you might imagine, this question is sometimes met with some stammering and stuttering: “Well, um, you know, Father, I’m really busy,” or, “My (grand)parents go to church every weekend....” A discussion usually ensues that outlines the minimum requirements of a practicing Catholic: Mass every Sunday and holy day (about 15% of the 365 days the Lord allots us each year—not very demanding); reception of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation (the last of the three a problem for those who dropped out of faith formation too early); living in accord with the basic teachings of the church and the gospel for one’s respective state in life (married or single). Again, this is the minimum and gets a certificate.

Our gospel this weekend reminds us of a higher standard. We are called to be more than practicing Catholics or even just nice people. We are all called to be saints. Our Savior has grafted us onto him through Baptism, as seamlessly as new branches are grafted onto new vines to produce abundant fruit and delicious wine. To take the metaphor to its full implications, our being grafted onto Christ means that our roots are sunk into the rich soil of the grace of Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. Everything we do—our work, family life, recreation, personal prayer, choices of entertainment, people with whom we associate—has to be rooted in Christ the True Vine. That’s hard work and takes a lifetime of surrender and sacrifice, but it starts with the minimum.

BIULETYN Parafialny

Żyjąc i tworząc, nie zastanawiamy się nawet nad tym, jakie owoce przynoszą nasze działania. Nierzadko nawet nie zastanawiamy się nad celem naszej drogi, bo żyjąc chwilą po prostu go nie zauważamy. Zdajemy sobie sprawę, że nasze życie to walka o przetrwanie, z dnia na dzień, z godziny na godzinę.



Często zdarza się, że wyważamy już otwarte drzwi, nie widzimy innych możliwości, widzimy tylko nasz wymyślony cel, nie dostrzegamy celów pośrednich, a czasami nawet nie widzimy celu głównego, jakim powinien być Jezus Chrystus. To właśnie On otwiera nam drzwi i daje propozycje życia, posługi.

Wystarczy wsłuchać się w słowa Pisma Świętego i zrozumieć, jakie drzwi otwierają się przed nami i jakie to propozycje na nas czekają. Drzwi Kościoła są dla nas zawsze otwarte, a propozycje jasnej przyszłości daje nam Chrystus Zmartwychwstały, który wyzwolił nas z grzechów przez Objawienie Prawdy. Przyjmując tę prawdę „nie miłujmy słowem i językiem, ale czynem i prawdą. Po tym poznamy, że jesteśmy z prawdy, i uspokoiemy przed Nim nasze serce.” (1 J 3,18-19). Pozostając w prawdzie, nie tylko uspokoiemy nasze serca, sumienia i duszę, nie tylko będziemy widzieli właściwy cel naszej wędrówki, lecz także dojrzymy do otwieranych nam przez udział w Eucharystii Drzwi z wiecznym zaproszeniem do radości i wzrastania w wierze, w Boga.

Czy odpowiednio rozumiemy ewangeliczne porównanie nas do latorośli pnącej się i przynoszącej owoc obfity? W końcu jesteśmy owocami, oby tylko nie robaczywymi, nie uschniętymi – takie się wyrzuca lub pali, bo cóż za korzyść z uschniętego krzewu, który nie przynosi owoców.

„Jeżeli we Mnie trwać będziecie, a słowa moje w was, poproście, o cokolwiek chcecie, a to wam się spełni. Ojciec mój przez to dozna chwały, że owoc obfity przyniesiecie i staniecie się moimi uczniami.” (J 15,7-8). Chcę żyć i trwać w obecności, chcę być uczniem, uczyć się od Pana miłości, miłosierdzia, dobroci, poszanowania dla innych, bo wtedy lepiej i łatwiej będzie mi się żyć.

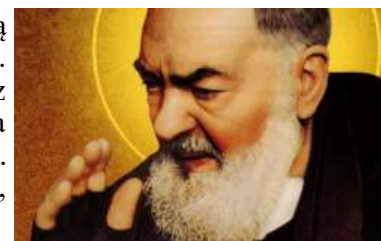
