

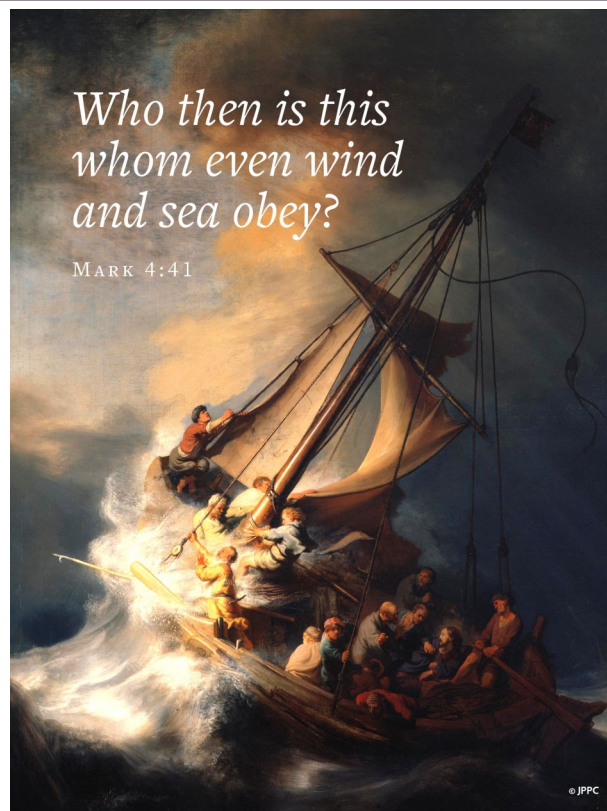

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things to you! Part of the richness of the liturgy since the Second Vatican Council has been the expansion of the variety and scope of the readings proclaimed from the Sacred Scriptures each Sunday. In addition, there is a thematic, theological connection between the first reading and the gospel passage. This Sunday is no exception.

The few verses of the first reading represent a small segment of a significant divine speech in which God reminds Job of the power and mystery of the Creator's ways. The Lord's words humble Job, to say the least, and remind us that we can never say we have completely understood God. We are always invited to delve deeper into the mystery of God's ways in our lives. Simply put, only God is God, and we are not.

The first reading specifically focuses, however, on the power of God over nature, a prerogative that in Jewish theology belongs to God alone. The correlation with the gospel is clear: Jesus does what only God can do because Jesus is God. That may seem like a self-evident truth to us, but our belief in Jesus as the Son of God should make all the difference in our lives. We cannot—as our culture sometimes does—simply consider Jesus as just one great religious teacher among many. In the history of world religions only Jesus makes the claim that he is God Incarnate, the Second Person of the Trinity made flesh. We do not simply follow a great teacher. We aim, through the power of the Holy Spirit, to be his presence in the world and do all through him, with him, and in him.

## BIULETYN Parafialny

Uczniowie Jezusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii byli przekonani, że nie da się nakarmić rzeszy głodnych ludzi. Ale Jezus nie pozwolił odesłać zgłodniałych, lecz kazał im usiąść do posiłku. Wszyscy zobaczyli moc Bożą, kiedy Pan uczynił cud rozmnożenia chleba i ryb, by nakarmić zgromadzonych słuchaczy. Nie przeszkodził Mu w tym nawet brak wiary apostołów.



Widzimy wokół nas ludzi, którzy nie szanują tego, co mają. I tak wyrzucają do kosza duże ilości jedzenia, dobre rzeczy. Ale są również takie rodziny, których nie stać na to, aby miały w domu co jeść i w co się ubrać, by wysłać dzieci na wakacje. Jako chrześcijanie jesteśmy wezwani nie tylko do tego, aby pokonywać głód u samych jego korzenie, ale również by dzielić się z potrzebującymi. I nie narzekać, że nic się z tym nie da zrobić. Jezus mówi do nas: „wy dajcie im jeść”, bo wiedział, że dzięki

temu zobaczymy więcej, niż tylko czubek własnego nosa. Dla naszego dobra mamy otwierać swoje serca, kieszenie i lodówki – żeby nie zamknąć się w swoim egoizmie. „Wy dajcie im jeść” oznacza: sami nie jesteście w stanie zaspokoić wszystkich potrzeb tego świata, potrzebujecie Mojej pomocy. Ale nie zrzucacie tego problemu tylko na Boga, to przez wasze zaangażowanie budowanie Królestwa Bożego na ziemi macie sprawić, żeby nie było wśród was głodnych i spragnionych.

Jezus wzywa nas do wrażliwego patrzenia, do szlachetnego serca i „otwartych oczu”. Oduczyliśmy się tego. Czekamy, aż ktoś poprosi o pomoc, aż się upomni, aż usiądzie na ulicy i postawi przed sobą pudełko – a i wtedy uwierzmy mu dopiero wtedy, gdy będzie dostatecznie brudny i zmęczony. A Jezus patrzył sercem – wiedział, że są głodni, więc nie pytał, czy może by coś zjedli. Czy mamy się więc domyślać potrzeb innych? Czy mamy ryzykować pomoc tym, którzy pomocy nie potrzebują? Wydaje mi się, że mając przed sobą konieczność jakiegoś ryzyka, lepiej zaryzykować zbędną pomoc, niż zaniechanie pomocy koniecznej. Kiedy zaczynamy stopniować ryzykujemy, że wzrok serca zmieni się nam we wzrok kieszeni – oślepiemy na Boga i człowieka. W chrześcijaństwie chodzi nie tylko o to, żeby kupić bułkę. Ale również o to, by podać ją tak, jak zrobiłby to Jezus. Mamy zobaczyć głodnych i pochylić się nad nimi, by umożliwić im spojrzenie poza ciało, spojrzenie w głąb ducha. W tym właśnie celu Jezus karmił głodnych na pustyni.

### **CZAS WYPOWIEDZIĆ SIĘ PRZECIWKO** - Samobójstwu wspomaganym przez lekarza!

Ustawodawcy Stanu Massachusetts mają jeszcze tylko 5 tygodni na rozważenie ustawy (**ustawa Senatu nr 1331**), która zalegalizowałaby samobójstwo wspomagane przez lekarza. Projekt ustawy nosi tytuł „**Ustawa dotycząca opcji na koniec życia**”. Razem, możemy dołączyć do pracowników służby zdrowia, grupy osób niepełnosprawnych, seniorów, i niezliczonych innych osób, aby **powiedzieć NIE** wspomaganemu samobójstwu! Możemy także przyłączyć się do naszych sąsiadów w New Hampshire i powstrzymać dalsze prace legislacyjne podczas tej sesji. Oto kilka niepokojących faktów, które należy wziąć pod uwagę, zanim skontaktujesz się z wybranymi senatorami:

- Projekt ustawy umożliwiłby lekarzowi podawanie śmiertelnej mieszanki leków osobie, u której zdiagnozowano mniej niż 6 miesięcy życia, która po spożyciu spowodowałaby śmierć.
- Diagnoza może być błędna. Niezliczona liczba osób przeżyła tę sześciomiesięczną diagnozę i cieszyła się wieloma cennymi miesiącami i latami spędzonymi z rodziną i przyjaciółmi.
- Brak rzeczywistych zabezpieczeń – bezbronna osoba, która jest niepełnosprawna fizycznie, w depresji lub boi się, że będzie „ciężarem”, może podlegać nadmiernemu wpływowi innych osób, aby zażyła mieszankę leków, zwłaszcza jeśli zachętą jest korzyść finansowa.
- Wybrani senatorzy powinni skupiać się przede wszystkim na ustawodawstwie zapewniającym wysokiej jakości opiekę zdrowotną, opiekę psychiatryczną i opiekę paliatywną chorym i umierającym – szczególnie w społecznościach niedostatecznie zaopatrzonych, biednych i mniejszościowych, które najbardziej cierpią.

**IT'S TIME TO SPEAK OUT IN OPPOSITION TO  
PHYSICIAN ASSISTED SUICIDE**

The Massachusetts State Legislature has only **six more weeks** to consider legislation (Senate Bill 1331) that would legalize the practice of Physician Assisted Suicide. The bill is titled, “*An Act relative to end of life options*”. Working together, we can join health care professionals, disability groups, senior citizens, the infirmed and countless individuals in saying **NO** to assisted suicide! We can also join our neighbors in New Hampshire<sup>1</sup> and stop the legislation from moving forward this session.

Here are some troubling facts to consider before you contact your elected officials:

- 1.) The bill would allow a physician to provide a deadly drug mixture to an individual diagnosed with less than 6 months to live that, when consumed, would cause death.  
NOTE - The diagnosis could be wrong. Countless individuals have outlived that 6-month diagnosis and enjoyed many more precious months and years with family and friends.
- 2.) No Real Safeguards - A vulnerable individual who is physically disabled, depressed, or fears being a “burden” may be subject to undue influence by others to take the drug mixture, especially if there is a financial benefit as an incentive.
- 3.) The primary focus of elected officials should be dedicated to legislation providing quality health care, mental health care and palliative care to the sick and dying – particularly in the underserved, poor and minority communities that suffer the most at the time of need.

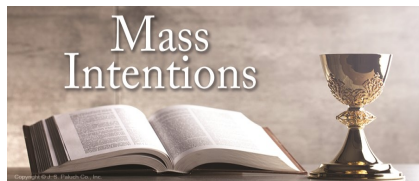

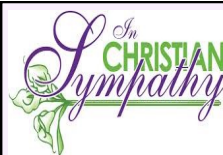
