Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things to you! Just about two years ago, I attended a conference entitled, "Priests for An Apostolic Age." The premise of the conference was something that we have known for quite a while now, i.e., that the world of Christendom is over. We no longer live in a culture that draws its strength from Christian values. Our faith can sometimes even be met with indifference or hostility. It is a world like that of the apostles, who first went out from the Upper Room fired by the Holy Spirit to spread the message of the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ in a pagan environment.

A second presupposition of the conference was that the laity need to be the primary evangelizers in this new apostolic age. This squares well with the role of the laity as described in the documents of the Second Vatican Council. Only the laity have the access and the numbers to enter every nook and cranny of this world. While we most often think of the ordained and consecrated religious as missionaries, the fact is that every baptized person is called to mission. Some may not feel adequate to the task, but learning how to share our Catholic faith in ways that attract and fascinate is a skill that can be acquired through practice.

On this World Mission Sunday, let's renew our call to mission that we received in baptism. Where will the Holy Spirit send you? Will you say yes?

**REMEMBERING OUR DECEASED** - On *Sunday, November 3rd*, a Mass will be celebrated in the Upper Basilica at 11:00 a.m., when the names of those who died in the last year will be read. # BIULETYN Parafialny

Prorok Izajasz zapowiada w pierwszym czytaniu Jezusa Chrystusa jako Sługę zmiażdżonego cierpieniem. List do Hebrajczyków ukazuje Go jako arcykapłana, „doświadczonego we wszystkim na nasze podobieństwo z wyjątkiem grzechu”. Nie jest łatwo zrozumieć, ani tym bardziej zaakceptować słowa Chrystusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii: „Jeśli kto by między wami chciał się stać wielki, niech będzie sługą waszym” i „Syn Człowieczy nie przyszedł, aby Mu służyło, lecz żeby służyć”. Jak mówi św. Edyta Stein wszyscy ochrzczeni są powołani, by służyć, ale nie wszyscy rozumieją to wezwanie.

MT 20, 28  
**NIE PRZYSZEDŁ,  
ABY MU SŁUŻONO,  
LE CZ ABY SŁUŻYĆ**



Wielu, jak dwaj synowie Zebedeusza, Jakub i jego brat Jan, podchodzi do Boga nie z prośbą, lecz z żądaniem. Rzecz się ma podobnie jak w kawiarni, gdzie gość przy stoliku prosi kelnera, ale jego prośba jest żądaniem. Kelner ma obowiązek spełnić tę prośbę, a gość ma prawo stawiać żądania. Przeniesienie tej postawy na Boga to poważne nieporozumienie. Z Ewangelii dowiadujemy się, że nawet Bóg nie traktuje człowieka jak chłopca na posyłki, ale jak przyjaciela. Tymczasem człowiek ma tendencje do sprowadzania Boga do roli swego sługi. Człowiekowi się wydaje, że im częściej wydaje rozkazy, tym jest ważniejszy. Im więcej ludzi jest do jego dyspozycji, tym większa jest jego wartość. Sny o wielkości łączą się z reguły z rzeszą wielbicieli, dumą sukcesu, rozgłosem i podziwem. Człowiek jednak nigdy nie będzie sobą, jeśli stara się realizować życie w garniturze o dwa numery dla niego za dużym. Prawdziwa wielkość umie zająć właściwe miejsce.

Pokora polega na dobrowolnym zajęciu tego miejsca, jakie Bóg nam wyznaczył. Św. Augustyn napisał trafnie: „gdzie pokora, tam majestat”. Nie co innego, lecz umiejętność zajęcia na każdym etapie życia tego miejsca, które wyznaczył Bóg, decyduje o wielkości. Być sługą to znaczy iść za Jezusem, coraz wierniej Go naśladować. To wezwanie wymaga jednoznacznej odpowiedzi. Chrześcijanin nie może być minimalistą. Nie wolno stać bezczynnie, być tylko widzem lub obserwatorem dokonujących się przemian społeczno-ekonomicznych. Nie można tylko narzekać, wspominając dawne czasy. Idzie nowe! Nowe czasy promują zaangażowanych, a pasywnych i malkontentów wyrzucają na margines życia społecznego.

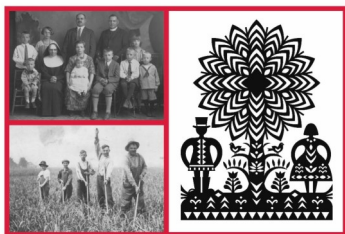
