Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

“Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you!” Although Bartimaeus could not see Jesus, our Savior saw him and called him forth to be healed. At first the crowds tried to keep the blind man quiet, but they changed their tune after Jesus acknowledged him above the noise of the crowds. The gospel records the miracle of Jesus restoring the blind man’s sight and then states that Bartimaeus “followed him on the way.”

The use of the phrase, “the way,” might have a double meaning. It can simply signify that Bartimaeus followed Jesus on the road. A second meaning, however, may refer to the fact that the earliest Christians were described as “followers of the Way.” Bartimaeus received back his physical sight, but the miracle gave him deeper insight into who Jesus really was. Jesus is not just a healer and giver of favors but someone who invites a total response. May our life of discipleship be such a total response to the One who calls us in the midst of our daily noise, heals us, and then challenges us to follow him on the Way.

BIULETYN Parafialny

W Liście apostolskim „Novo millennio ineunte” św. Jan Paweł II stwierdził, że „mimo rozległych procesów laicyzacji obserwujemy dziś w świecie powszechną potrzebę duchowości, która w znacznej mierze ujawnia się jako nowy głód modlitwy” (n. 33). Odpowiedzią na ten „głód modlitwy” są duchowe poszukiwania wielu ludzi. Warto więc odnaleźć w tradycji Kościoła bogactwo form i treści modlitewnych, które zostały ukształtowane przez wieki.



Niewidomy żebrak Bartymeusz spod Jerycha, który siedział przy drodze, słysząc o przechodzącym Jezusie z Nazaretu głośno wołał: „Jezusie, Synu Dawida, ulituj się nade mną”. Pan nie pozostał głuchy na jego wołanie i przyszedł mu z konkretną pomocą: „Jezus mu rzekł: «Idź, twoja wiara cię uzdrowiła». Natychmiast przejrzał i szedł za Nim drogą”. Słowa wypowiedziane przez niewidomego z dzisiejszej Ewangelii stały się wezwaniem „modlitwy Jezusowej”, zwanej inaczej modlitwą serca albo nieustanną modlitwą. Jest to modlitwa na każdy czas.

Modlitwa serca stanowi proste wołanie o pomoc, o miłosierdzie. Jej praktykowanie pomaga przemieniać nasze życie, otwiera nas coraz bardziej na Boga. Nie jest to modlitwa przeznaczona tylko dla pobożnych mnichów, ale przede wszystkim dla ludzi świeckich, zatopionych w wir codzienności. Serafin z Sarowa, ostatni kanonizowany święty przed rewolucją rosyjską 1917 roku, ulubiony patron prawosławia i jeden z większych mistyków Kościoła, mówił: modlić się może każdy bez przeszkód. Bogaty i biedny, szlachetnie urodzony i wieśniak, mocny i słaby, zdrowy i chory, cnotliwy i grzesznik”.

WYPOMINKI ZA ZMARŁYCH Zbliża się listopad, miesiąc pamięci i modlitw za zmarłych. „Modlitwa za zmarłych jest ważną powinnością, bowiem nawet jeśli odesli w łasce i przyjaźni z Bogiem, być może potrzebują ostatniego oczyszczenia, by dostąpić radości nieba” powiedział Jan Paweł II. Przez cały miesiąc listopad będziemy się modlić za naszych zmarłych polecanych w tegorocznych **Wypominkach**. Serdecznie zapraszamy do udziału w Nabożeństwie Wypominkowym w każdą środę po Mszy świętej o godzinie 19:00. Wszyscy, którzy pragną dołączyć swoich zmarłych do naszych wspólnych modlitw bardzo prosimy o wypełnienie kartek z wypisanymi czytelnie imionami swoich bliskich zmarłych i przynieść je do O. Lucjana lub do biura parafialnego.

PAMIĘTAJMY O NASZYCH ZMARŁYCH - W niedzielę 3 listopada o godz. 11:00 AM w Bazylice górnej będzie odprawiona Msza św., podczas której zostaną odczytane nazwiska zmarłych od 1 listopada ubiegłego roku. W naszej Bazylice wystawiane zostaną ich zdjęcia. Zdjęcia można przynieść do biura parafialnego z podaniem następujących danych – imię i nazwisko zmarłego oraz datę zgonu, w tym imię i nazwisko, adres i numer telefonu osoby, do której zdjęcia mają być zwrócone.

PROCESJA NA CMENTARZU - Coroczna procesja w intencji naszych bliskich zmarłych odbędzie się w niedzielę, 3 listopada o godzinie 2:00 po południu – deszcz czy słońce! Prosimy się odpowiednio ubrać.

SAKRAMENT NAMASZCZENIA CHORYCH – będzie udzielany dziś, w niedzielę bezpośrednio po wszystkich Mszach św.

POTRZEBNA POMOC PRZY ROBIENIU PIEROGÓW – z kapusty, dziś o godzinie 9:00 AM w szkolnej stołówce, w ramach przygotowań do nadchodzącego sezonu świątecznego. Natomiast w niedzielę 10 listopada planujemy zrobić pierogi z serem i ziemniakami. Nie jest wymagane żadne doświadczenie – zapewniamy przeszkolenie!

INTENCJE NA MSZE ŚWIĘTE NA ROK 2025 – można zamawiać w biurze parafialnym od **poniedziałku, 28 października**. Rozumiemy potrzebę prośb o kilka Mszy św. za tę samą osobę lub o tej samej Rodziny. W rezultacie wielu parafian nie ma możliwości zamówienia choćby jednej Mszy św. Nie ma sposobu, aby całkowicie zaradzić tej sytuacji, ale wierzymy, że w najlepszym interesie wszystkich Parafian jest przyjęcie następującego ograniczenia: **Intencje Mszy św. będą początkowo ograniczone do trzech (3) zarezerwowanych dat na rodzinę (1 w weekend i 2 w dni powszednie)**, aby KAŻDA RODZINA miała możliwość upamiętnienia ukochanej osoby podczas Mszy świętej. Po miesiącu to ograniczenie zostanie zniesione. UWAGA: **sugerowana ofiara** na Mszę św. we wszystkich kościołach naszej diecezji jest obecnie **\$15.00**.

There isn't any way to completely remedy this situation, but we believe that it is in the best interest of all Parishioners to establish the following policy: Mass intentions will be limited to three (3) reserved dates per family initially (1 weekend Mass and 2 weekday Masses). This policy will be reviewed and possibly change in the month of December. *Per the Diocese of Springfield, the suggested offering per Mass is \$15.*
