Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! Reflecting on the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is a bit like stepping back from the air we breathe to study it from the outside. Such a feast as we celebrate this weekend can tend toward over-intellectualizing a mystery we are first called to live. Nevertheless, it is an aid to our salvation to immerse our minds and hearts in the Mystery at the heart of our lives and our world.

This feast proclaims that God is not just a vague spiritual force or a deep fuzzy feeling when we choose to be spiritual. Much of the discourse around the divine in our secular culture, if it cares at all about God, often sounds like this foggy religiosity. Christians firmly believe that God is essentially a community of Three Persons in One, united by a love so great that the earth was created and humanity was willed into being to reflect the very image of this overflowing communitarian love. That God is a communion of love among divine persons tells us how we are to live if we wish to mirror that divine image in our daily lives.

Such generative and generous love also calls to mind Father's Day. Whatever our experience of fatherhood has been, we recognize it when it is at its best. Research continues to show that children need fathers or father figures to flourish and not merely survive. Another interesting statistic is that children are more likely to practice their faith if their dads practice it, even if moms go to church every day.

Today we rejoice with the whole Church in proclaiming the divine love of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, a love so powerful that it wants to immerse us in it and would have us reflect it in our own lives of love and service. "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!"

PARISH CEMETERY NEWS

Remember that artificial decorations, artificial flowers, votive candles, bells, toys and fences of any kind are not allowed according to our cemetery regulations because they are dangerous for employees, especially when mowing the grass. Fresh flowers in pots and boxes are allowed, as long as they look fresh and are properly cared for. However, planting trees, shrubs and flowers in the ground is prohibited. **We also remind you that the speed limit on the roads of our cemetery is 10 miles/hour.** Thank you for helping to maintain our cemetery in safe conditions for everyone with a natural and beautiful appearance.

Odrębny obchód ku czci Trójcy Świętej powstał w liturgii stosunkowo późno, bo dopiero w XI wieku. W roku 1334 papież Jan XXI rozszerzył go na cały Kościół. Św. Rupert, opat (+ ok. 1180), zna to święto i tłumaczy, z jakiego powodu zostało ono umieszczone w najbliższą niedzielę po Zesłaniu Ducha Świętego: „[...] wkrótce po Zstąpieniu Ducha Świętego prawda Chrystusowa i chrzest przez Niego nakazany w imię Ojca i Syna i Ducha Świętego były udzielane po całym świecie. Tak przeto uroczystość dzisiejsza jest najpiękniejszym zamknięciem cyklu zbawienia”. W Polsce z tym dniem kończy się również czas spowiedzi i Komunii wielkanocnej.



W aklamacji przed Ewangelią wybrzmiały słowa: „Chwała Ojcu i Synowi, i Duchowi Świętemu, Bogu, który jest i który był, i który przychodzi” (por. Ap 1,8). Wiara w jednego Boga w trzech Osobach jest jednym z najbardziej specyficznych elementów chrześcijaństwa. Żadna inna religia tej tajemnicy nie podaje do wierzenia. Istnienie Trójcy Świętej jest dogmatem naszej wiary. Samym ludzkim rozumem nie doszlibyśmy do tej prawdy. Objawił nam to Pan Jezus. W Katechizmie Kościoła Katolickiego możemy natomiast przeczytać: „Tajemnica Trójcy Świętej stanowi centrum tajemnicy wiary i życia chrześcijańskiego. Tylko sam Bóg, objawiając się, może nam pozwolić poznać się jako Ojciec, Syn i Duch Święty” (KKK 261). Warto też zauważyć, że od XII wieku bardzo rozpowszechnił się symbol: Boga Ojca w postaci starca, siedzącego na tronie, Syna Bożego, rozpiętego na krzyżu, który jest oparty o kolana Boga Ojca i Ducha Świętego w postaci gołębicę.

2. List do Rzymian, jak słyszeliśmy, wprowadza jeszcze jedną bardzo ważną odpowiedź w rozumienie Trójcy Świętej. Boga możemy „osiągnąć” przez cnoty teologalne: wiarę, nadzieję i miłość. Apostoł Paweł mówi otwarcie, że już dostąpiliśmy usprawiedliwienia przez wiarę. Wiara zaś sprawia, że akceptujemy przeróżne trudności i uciski w nadziei na nagrodę w niebie. Gdy to czynimy, wzrastamy w cnotach – owocach Ducha Świętego. A dzieje się to z jedyne go motywu i powodu – z miłości ku Bogu. Każdy, kto kocha Boga całym sobą, jest w stanie wnikać w Jego nieskończoną głębię. Tego właśnie On pragnie – abyśmy Go kochali i z Nim byli zawsze. I w ten sposób poznajemy życie – tajemnicę samego Boga.

Antoine de Saint-Exupéry powie, że „Tajemnica nie jest murem, ale horyzontem. Tajemnica nie uśmierca inteligencji, ale jest ogromną przestrzenią, którą Bóg ofiaruje naszemu pragnieniu Prawdy”. Jakie znaczenie dla mojego życia ma ta Tajemnica? Ks. Bronisław Bozowski w książce „Proboszcz niezwyklej parafii” tak mówi o tej Tajemnicy w swoim życiu: „W seminarium traktat o Najświętszej Trójcy wykładano nam ponad pół roku. Egzamin zdałem na piątkę, ale nic z tego nie wynikało dla mojego życia. Dopiero później, chyba gdzieś w dziesiątym roku kapłaństwa, dostałem monografię O. Hugo o dogmacie Najświętszej Trójcy. I wtedy »zakochałem się« w tej Tajemnicy. Dla mnie dawniej ta Tajemnica była bliska w niedzielę, teraz uświadomiłem sobie, że jesteśmy stworzeni na obraz i podobieństwo Najświętszej Trójcy, a więc winniśmy żyć na Jej podobieństwo. Trójca Święta to nie zamknięty klan, towarzystwo wzajemnej adoracji. Ona jest otwarta na cały świat. Bóg nie jest Bogiem zimnym, obcym i dalekim, ale współczuje ze światem, współcierpi i współraduje się z ludźmi”.

Świętujmy 125 lat wiary, przyjaźni i wspólnoty — razem!

Świeże kwiaty w doniczkach i pudełkach są dozwolone, o ile wyglądają świeżo i są odpowiednio pielęgnowane. Natomiast sadzenie w ziemi drzew, krzewów i kwiatów jest zabronione. Przypominamy również że dopuszczalna prędkość na drogach naszego cmentarza jest 10 mil/godzinę. Dziękujemy za pomoc w utrzymaniu naszego cmentarza w bezpiecznych dla wszystkich warunkach o naturalnym i pięknym wyglądzie.

Qualified Charitable Distribution



A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) made directly to a qualified nonprofit organization such as the Basilica of Saint Stanislaus, without having the distribution counted as taxable income.

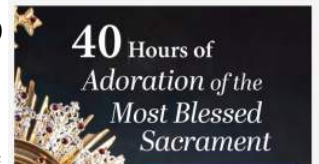
If you are 70 ½ years of age or older and have a Traditional IRA, you are eligible to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution. Currently in 2025, up to \$108,000 in IRA funds can be counted as Qualified Charitable Distributions annually. For married couples, each spouse can make Qualified Charitable Distributions up to the \$108,000 limit for a potential total of \$216,000.
