

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things to you! When we soak in the sights and sounds of the culture around us, we can readily see that humility is a virtue in rather short supply these days. Humble people do not often get many likes on their YouTube videos, probably because they haven't made a video about themselves. We are more apt to see the wild, the risky, and in-your-face type of people who are advertising their feats of mind or body.

Jesus' parable and the wisdom of the sacred scriptures this Sunday call us to a different standard. Sirach counsels that we remember that true greatness lies in recognizing our continual need for wisdom and our status as finite creatures of God. Jesus will cast the same teaching in the form of a parable in which we start from the lowest seat at a banquet and possibly be open to moving up higher if so invited by the host. While most of us could imagine embarrassment in being asked to take a lesser seat, those rooted in a culture based on honor and shame, as Jesus' listeners were, would see this demotion as a social disgrace.

Humility was not prized much in Greek and Roman culture and was viewed rather as a sign of weakness. It was Christianity that exalted humility as something to be desired in one's relationship with God. Perhaps the most famous proponent in modern times was St. Theresa of the Child Jesus. She loved her littleness, as she would say, and was content to imagine herself as a child safe in the warm embrace of a merciful and loving Father. Sounds like a good place to be.

Have a safe, blessed, and humble Labor Day weekend!

BIULETYN Parafialny

Jezus wiele razy naucza o umiejętności dawania. To właśnie sposób, w jaki dzielimy się z innymi swoimi dobrami, pokazuje nasz prawdziwy stosunek do bliźnich. Ideał relacji międzyludzkich z perspektywy chrześcijaństwa to bezinteresowność, czyli robienie czegoś bez oczekiwania czegoś w zamian. Ktoś może powiedzieć, że nie może nic robić bezinteresownie, bo go na to nie stać. Czy rzeczywiście tak jest? Można chyba stwierdzić, że nawet gdybyśmy nagle stali się bogaci, niekoniecznie staniemy się bezinteresowni. Niewielu ludzi potrafi określić granicę: mam nadmiar, oddam potrzebującemu. Bezinteresowność to nie kwestia materialna. To taka "zaraźliwa" dobroć. Ten, kto jej nie doświadczył na własnej skórze, będzie miał problem, żeby sam stać się człowiekiem bezinteresownym. A bezinteresowny to ten, który działa ze szlachetnych pobudek.



Źródła bezinteresowności należy szukać najpierw w ludzkim sercu. Tak robi wielu młodych ludzi, którzy jeszcze nie dysponują środkami materialnymi. Jeśli ktoś mówi, że wszyscy młodzi są źli, to bardzo poważnie mija się z prawdą. Wystarczy spojrzeć, ilu młodych ludzi jest zaangażowanych w bezinteresowną pomoc innym. Powstają koła wolontariuszy, którzy są obecni w szpitalach, domach pomocy, pogotowiach opiekuńczych czy hospicjach. Poświęcają swój czas, aby pomagać innym, którzy potrzebują wsparcia. Nieraz zdarza się, że to wsparcie jest potrzebne gdzieś blisko, za ścianą mieszkania, w którym żyjemy. Wiele osób oczekuje na życzliwą dłoń, choćby drobny gest dobroci, który nigdy nie traci swojej wartości. Pewna nastolatka wyznała: "Mam sąsiada inwalidę, któremu pomagam już od lat, bo właściwie on nie opuszcza swojego mieszkania (problemy fizyczne i psychiczne), co miesiąc wpłacam pieniądze na konto polskich dzieci głodujących i robię jeszcze kilka innych tzw. dobrych uczynków. Nie sądzę jednak, żebym miała jakieś szczególne powody do dumy!". To tylko jeden z wielu pięknych przykładów cichej pomocy, które spotykamy w naszym codziennym życiu.

"Razem w nadziei" to temat **DOROCZNEJ ZBIÓRKI KATOLICKIEJ 2025**, powracającej po rocznej przerwie w całej diecezji. Mamy wiele do zrobienia poprzez posługi i misje wspierane przez doroczną zbiórkę katolicką. Biskup Byrne prosi Was o modlitewne rozważenie wsparcia finansowego. Doroczna zbiórka katolickia finansuje posługi i agencje pracujące nad zaspokojeniem wielu potrzeb. Wasze donacje karmią głodnych, chronią i szanują życie, odziewają potrzebujących i pomagają rozwijać Kościół katolicki. Dotychczas 202 rodzin z naszej Parafii złożyło ofiarę \$23,641. Prosimy o hojne wsparcie na miarę Waszej możliwości.

Please know that we understand the desire to have several Masses offered for the same person, or by the same family. The result is that many parishioners are left with no option to have even one weekend Mass. There isn't any way to completely remedy this situation, but we believe that it is in the best interest of all Parishioners to establish the following policy: Mass intentions will be limited to three (3) reserved dates per family initially (1 weekend Mass and 2 weekday Masses). This policy will be reviewed and possibly change in the month of December. *Per the Diocese of Springfield, the suggested offering per Mass is \$15.*

Qualified Charitable Distribution

Leave a A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a distribution from your Individual Retirement Ac-Legacy count (IRA) made directly to a qualified nonprofit organization such as the Basilica of Saint Stanislaus, without having the distribution counted as taxable income.

If you are 70 ½ years of age or older and have a Traditional IRA, you are eligible to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution. Currently in 2025, up to \$108,000 in IRA funds can be counted as Qualified Charitable Distributions annually. For married couples, each spouse can make Qualified Charitable Distributions up to the \$108,000 limit for a potential total of \$216,000.
