

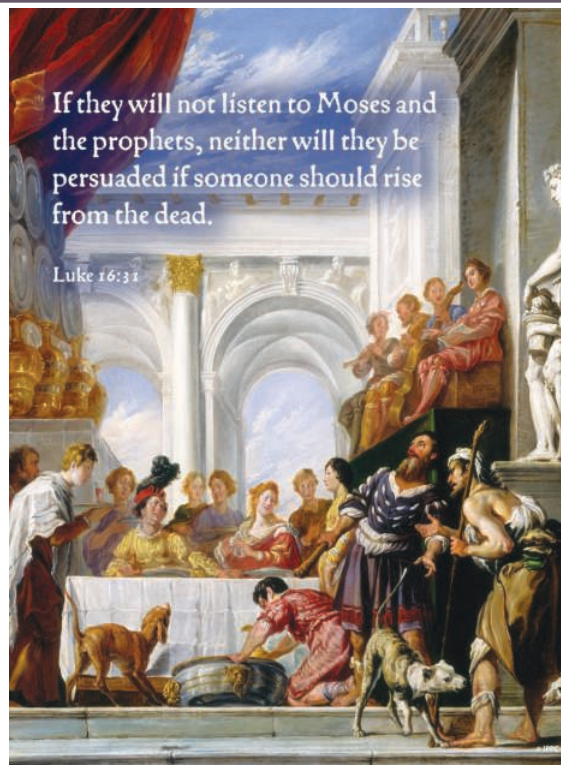

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things to you! This Sunday the shocking nature of Jesus' story might make us wonder how anyone could be so callous toward fellow human beings who are brothers and sisters in the family of God. However, we all know that such sad events happen every day, both locally and on the global level, especially in places where war, terror, famine, and brutal violence occur regularly. The mercy of God is offered even to the worst sinners, up until the last breath, but Jesus reminds us that all our actions have eternal consequences.

There is another issue raised by today's scripture readings, namely, that our ongoing conversion involves both love of God and love of neighbor. Some Christians, influenced by social movements and secular philosophies, have taken the focus off personal repentance and holiness in their desire to make a better world. Others have so emphasized personal holiness and devotion that social issues are left to "social justice people." Both extremes fall short of the gospel.

Sainthood, to which all of us are called by our baptism, keeps the whole of reality, visible and invisible, before us. As Pope Francis was fond of saying, if we neglect the personal prayer, liturgy, and mystical life of the church, we are no different from an NGO based on purely secular principles. If we do not concretely serve the poor and help relieve the causes of human suffering, however, we literally do not do justice to the world God created as good and destined to be enjoyed by all.

BIULETYN Parafialny

W ewangelicznej przypowieści spotykamy w świątyni faryzeusza i celnika. Obydwaj są grzesznikami, ale między nimi jest istotna różnica. Faryzeusz to człowiek skrzętnie wypełniający wynikające z Prawa tzw. „obowiązków religijne”: post i jałmużnę. Ma tylko problem z modlitwą, w czasie której poszukuje siebie i własnej doskonałości, a nie myśli o Bogu. Tu oto ujawnia się obłudna natura faryzeusza. Obłuda jest zawsze przejawem braku dobrej woli i z natury swej zamyka drzwi Chrystusowi, przesłania prawdę o sobie. Tym samym uniemożliwia nawrócenie. Jezus Chrystus wyraźnie krytykuje taką „fasadową pobożność”, która zamiast rozwijać relację do Boga, skupia się na własnej doskonałości. Faryzeusz jest przykładem człowieka, który staje się kolekcjonerem dobrych uczynków. Co więcej, wyznaje przekonanie, że to wystarczy do zbawienia.

Świadomość własnej słabości i niewystarczalności sprawia natomiast, że ewangeliczny celnik, a więc człowiek powszechnie pogardzany z racji na współpracę z rzymskim najeźdźcą, nie kieruje palca w stronę drugiego. Jest świadomy, że nawet na słusznym oskarżeniu bliźniego nie zbije duchowej fortuny i nie zyska przebaczenia Bożego. Przebaczenie można uzyskać jedynie czyniąc rachunek z własnych grzechów i okazując skrucę serca. To naturalny odruch serca pod wpływem działającej łaski. Celnik z dzisiejszej przypowieści był zatem – podobnie jak faryzeusz – grzesznikiem, ale grzesznikiem świadomym swojego wewnętrznego stanu. I ta świadomość wyzwoliła w nim skrucę serca, która jest warunkiem uzyskania Bożego przebaczenia i umożliwia działanie Boga. Pan nie gardzi bowiem sercem skruszonym. Celnik odszedł więc usprawiedliwiony, albowiem „kto się wywyższa, będzie poniżony, a kto się unią, będzie wywyższony”.

Razem z przyjściem Jezusa rozpoczął się nowy rozdział w relacjach Bóg – człowiek. Jezus zechciał uczestniczyć w dramatycznym - spowodowanym grzechem – dialogu miłości między Bogiem a człowiekiem. Obecność Jezusa wśród nas jako Syna Bożego i Człowieczego była, jest i będzie nieustannym świadectwem miłości Boga do nas, grzeszników. Jezus nie tylko wskazuje nam, jak żyć miłością, jak ogarniać nią Boga i ludzi. Ale także uzdalnia nas do miłości. W Nim doświadczamy, że Bóg nas kocha, i jesteśmy przynaglani, by odwzajemniać się Mu miłością. Każdy, kto się do Niej zbliży, zostaje nie tylko uratowany od śmierci wiecznej, ale i napełniony miłością – życiem samego Boga. Doświadczwszy, jak dobry jest Pan, św. Franciszek z Asyżu z bólem serca wołał: „Miłość nie jest kochana!”. Wyśmiewano go, bo ludzie nie rozumieli, o co mu chodzi. Nie pojmowali, że każdy człowiek powinien żyć w miłości Pana, że od tego zależy jego szczęście.
