The following are highlighted from our RULES and are for ALL, NO EXCEPTIONS. Too many have ignored and violated the rules and regulations. Why do some just presume the rules do not apply to them? **OBSERVE THE CEMETERY RULES!**

The following items are NOT PERMITTED at all: **glass of any description, vases, watering cans, food tins, wood or iron cases, cardboard containers, votive lights, candles, ornaments or bric-a-brac, and will be removed without notice.**

NOT PERMITTED ALSO are hearts, Bibles, novelties, temporary crosses or grave markers, or granite/slate plates placed on ground in front of monuments.

NOT PERMITTED are: statues, toys, balloons and artificial flowers (or artificial anything) Any and all of these items are subject for immediate removal and will be discarded. Removal of these items is done without prior notification by the cemetery authority.

Thus, NO coping, curbing, fencing, hedging, borders or enclosures of any kind shall be allowed around grave lots.

NO ANIMALS/PETS are allowed in the cemetery as they are a risk to other visitors. St. Francis, patron of pets, loves animals, but walking them at the cemetery may leave us with other issues.

All grading, improvements, care and maintenance of the grave sites shall be done solely by the cemetery staff, unless permission has been otherwise granted by the cemetery authorities.

Potted plants that have been buried into the ground shall be removed without notice.

NO spreading of fertilizers, ashes or other materials that stimulate the growth of grass.

Shrine to the Blessed Virgin Mary in front of the Friary

DO NOT LEAVE flowers, plants, candles, votives, decorations of any kind at the Shrine, other than those done regularly by the caretaker of the Shrine or Basilica Staff!!!
