

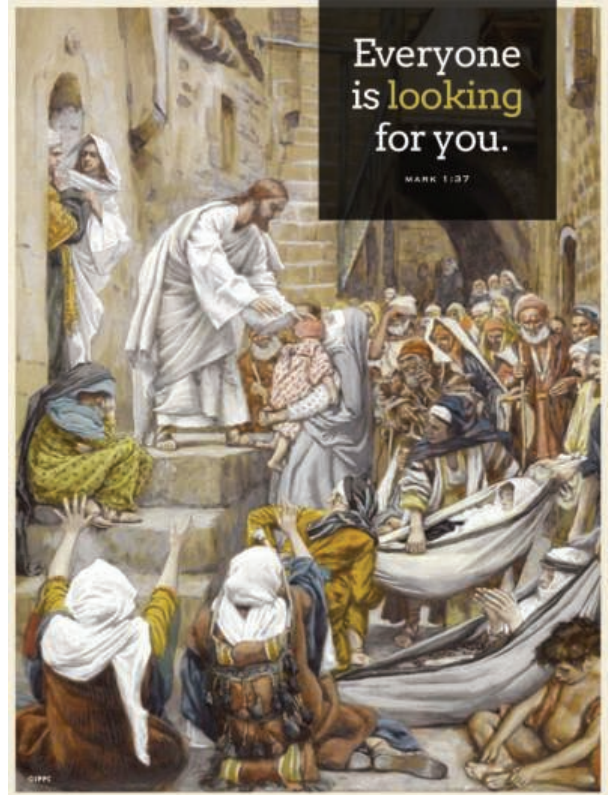

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! This time of year can be a difficult one for many people. We often speak of the winter blahs in these post-Christmas weeks. There is no major holiday to speak of. The snow has not left us, and warmer temperatures are not guaranteed. It is as if the speech of Job in the first reading this Sunday were written just for early February. We can be grateful that Job teaches us such honesty and candor in our relationship with God, and he certainly had much to argue about with God regarding his sudden reversal of fortune.

The pairing of this reading from the Book of Job with the verses from the first chapter of Mark's gospel in today's liturgy may not seem too obvious. The linking of the two scripture passages, however, is not accidental or random. Here I would like to acknowledge my gratitude to the insights of Gerhard Lohfink in his book entitled, *Jesus of Nazareth: What He Wanted, Who He Was*. Many scholars refer to this passage from Mark as "a day in the life of Jesus," and what a busy one it was despite it being the Sabbath! Starting with a synagogue service and the healing of Simon Peter's mother-in-law, Jesus' fame begins to spread. The sick and possessed are coming to him from all directions, and Jesus heals many of them. Undoubtedly in need of communion with his Father, Jesus rises early the next morning and goes off to a deserted place to pray. Jesus has redeemed time by his own presence within it and his offering of it in prayer to the Father.

For us Christians, the day need no longer be a drudgery because each moment holds the promised hope of an encounter with the living God. Yes, we may be busy. Yes, we may feel like we never stop doing and doing and doing--similar to what Jesus felt that day. Yet now the hours and minutes hold the promise of the healing and rejuvenating presence of the Word-made-flesh, present everywhere now in his risen life. May each day hold this promise for you.

Consider Leaving a Lasting Legacy**Qualified Charitable Distribution**

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a tax-smart decision while increasing the impact of your support of St. Stanislaus Basilica by considering a transfer from your IRA.

Many of you may be familiar with the term "*Qualified Charitable Distribution*" or QCD. This is a distribution from your IRA paid directly to a charity.

If you are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can direct your IRA custodian to send a portion of your annual distribution up to \$100,000 to support St. Stanislaus Basilica.

Now, why would you want to do this?

The average standard deduction is much higher than it has been in the past and many taxpayers will find that they do not have enough to itemize. This means their gifts to St. Stanislaus Basilica will not count as a tax deduction.

If you are one of those people who can no longer itemize deductions and you write a check to St. Stanislaus Basilica, you will not get a tax deduction. But if you use the QCD option from your IRA, then you will directly reduce your income, save in taxes, and make a big impact on the future of St. Stanislaus Basilica and all its ministries.

BIULETYN Parafialny

Wokół Jezusa gromadziły się rzesze ludzi. Spragnieni byli słowa, jakie im Jezus głosił. Przychodzili także, by szukać uzdrowienia duszy i ciała. Jak mówi Ewangelista: „Uzdrowił wielu dotkniętych rozmaitymi chorobami i wiele złych duchów wyrzucił”. Możemy sobie wyobrazić, jak bardzo był zajęty. Ale nie dał się pochłonać do końca szaleńczej aktywności. „Nad ranem, gdy jeszcze było ciemno, wstał, wyszedł i udał się na miejsce pustynne i tam się modlił”. Wiedział, jak wielu jest jeszcze nieuzdrowionych, że tylu przychodzi do Niego ze swoimi bólami, tylu przecież cierpi po dziś dzień, na całym świecie – a jednak usuwał się w cień, aby trwać na modlitwie. Nawet Jezus potrzebował czasu dla siebie, odpoczynku, modlitwy. Potrzebował przede wszystkim kontaktu ze swoim Ojcem i to był sekret Jego ogromnej mocy i skuteczności działania.



My także potrzebujemy kontaktu z Bogiem, aby naładować się Bożą energią, która pomaga pełniej i sensowniej żyć. Dzisiejszy człowiek popada, jak nigdy dotąd, w różnego rodzaju depresje, gubi się w życiu. A to dlatego, że zagubił nieraz zdolność kontaktu z Bogiem, zastępując go różnego rodzaju „liturgiami”, choćby przed telewizorem, na stadionie czy w galerii handlowej. Wydaje się, że współczesnemu człowiekowi najbardziej potrzeba refleksji, czyli zastanowienia się i rozmyślenia nad samym sobą, nad wartością i celem swojego życia, wybiegającym daleko poza ziemię.

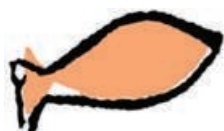

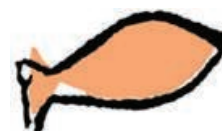

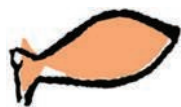
