

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of the open questions for the whole Catholic world these days is to what extent the COVID pandemic has affected Mass attendance. Throughout the Catholic world it seems that many who originally stayed home because of previously closed churches, quarantines, and legitimate fears of infection continue to remain at home on Sundays and holydays: "It's just as good to watch Mass online...." (How do you receive communion through a screen?) "I don't get anything out of it...." (What do you put into it?) "The time got away from me...." (Set an alarm on your phone.) "By the time I remembered, there were no Sunday Masses left...." (Nowhere?) "The Patriots are playing...." (Sports is a really bad excuse.) "Do you think Jesus really cares?" (Answer: Yes.) The list goes on, and some of the excuses existed long before COVID.

Participation in the Eucharist on Sundays and holydays remains a grave obligation for Catholics (*Catechism*, nos. 2180-2183), but it's not just because "the Catholic Church likes rules." A key to why Mass is indispensable to the Christian life is found in today's second reading from St. Paul, whose conversion, by the way, we mark as a feast on the church calendar this week (Jan. 25th). When each of us was baptized, we became part of the body of Christ—whether we like it or not. We have a mutual responsibility to support each other in faith and contribute to the health and salvation of the whole body. We are not saved alone. As appealing as it might sound sometimes, heaven is not an endless series of hermitages. When people have said to me that they can pray just as well at home by themselves, I simply respond: "No, you can't. You need the rest of the body." Besides, we need to feed on the actual Body of Christ, the Eucharist, to thrive as members of His body.

In this Year of the Eucharist, let's make a commitment to reach out to those faltering limbs we know and invite them back. Their salvation depends on it—ours too.

BIULETYN Parafialny

STYCZEN 23, 2022 - III NIEDZIELA ZWYKŁA

W roku 1975 17 letni Charls Rumbaugh, cierpiący na depresję maniacką, ucieka ze szpitala dla psychicznie chorych. Wkrótce po ucieczce napada na sklep i niespodziewanym strzałem zabija właściciela. Schwytyany, został skazany na karę śmierci. Na wykonanie wyroku czekał 10 lat. W tym czasie przeszedł ogromną przemianę duchową. Na początku jego serce przepełnione było nienawiścią do wszystkich. Nie znalazł spokoju. Kilka tygodni przed egzekucją mówi do swoich przyjaciół: „Przyszła już czas, kiedy powinniśmy odplacić dobrem za zło bez względu na cenę. Wiem, że w sercu miałem wiele nienawiści do każdego, ale to nie jest to, czego oczekuje ode mnie Chrystus”. Następnie prosi przyjaciół o modlitwę, aby miał moc wybaczenia i przemiany. Otrzymał to. Wewnętrznie wolny idzie na spotkanie Boga. Chrystus nie przywrócił mu wolności fizycznej, co więcej nie uwolnił go o wyroku śmierci, ale dał mu wolność ducha i nadzieję zbawienia. Rozpoczął się dla niego czas mesjański.

Benedetta Bianchi Porro, jako kilkunastoletnie dziecko zachorowała na paraliż dziecięcy, po którym pozostał niedowład nóg. Wraz z rozwojem dziewczynki choroba coraz bardziej odziera ją z życia, zabiera słuch, wzrok i mowę. Była zdolną dziewczyną, mimo tych ograniczeń osiąga dobre wyniki na studiach. W końcu przychodzi śmierć. W swym ogromnym cierpieniu napisała wiele listów. Oto fragment jednego z nich z książki „Oblicza nadziei”: „Osobiście jestem pogodna. Bóg chciał abym była w takim stanie, w jakim jestem. Nie obawiam się Boga. Jesteśmy w Jego rękach. Te najczulsze ręce, które prowadzą nas drogą miłości i pokoju. Jeżeli oddamy się im, nie będziemy nigdy, nawet przez moment opuszczeni. Bóg troszczy się o kwiaty na łąkach i ptaki w powietrzu. Tym bardziej otoczy opieką nas, jesteśmy o wiele więcej niż ziele i ptaki. Szukajcie Królestwa Bożego i jego sprawiedliwości, a wszystko inne będzie wam dodane. Oto dlaczego jestem pełna radości”

„W zasadzie znalazłem pięć rodzajów chrześcijan. Pierwsza grupa to chrześcijanami tylko z nazwy. Są to poganie, którzy zostali kiedyś ochrzczeni. Nie zachowują żadnych praw chrześcijańskich. Nie znają nauki Księgi i nie odgrywa ona żadnej roli w ich życiu. Druga grupa, to chrześcijanie z przyzwyczajenia. Znają naukę Księgi, akceptują, ale to nie ma żadnego wpływu na ich życie. Żyją tak, jakby nie znali nauki Księgi. Ich życie bardzo często jest przeciwne tej nauce. Trzecia grupa to ludzie, którzy cenią naukę Księgi i starają się żyć według niej. Robią wiele dobrego, ale wydaje się, że coś bardzo istotnego z nauki Księgi zagubili. Mają niewiele z ducha swego Mistrza. Czwartą grupę można nazwać praktykującymi chrześcijanami. Wygląda na to, że sercem przyjęli naukę Księgi. Są zatroskani o innych ludzi. Nie wstydzą się swego chrześcijaństwa. Są oni w niektórych miejscach prześladowani, co gorsze w niektórych społeczeństwach są traktowani obojętnie. Ostatnia, stosunkowo nieliczna grupa, którą bez wątpliwości mogę nazwać autentycznymi chrześcijanami. Są to ludzie uduchowieni, żyją według wskazań zawartych w Księdze. Są pogodni, szczęśliwi nawet w niesprzyjających okolicznościach życia. Życzliwie nastawieni do świata i bliźniego. Przy spotkaniu z nimi czułem, że spotykam samego Chrystusa.






