



STYCZEN 30, 2022 - IV NIEDZIELA ZWYKŁA

Dla tych, którzy opuścili dom rodzinny piosenka pt. „Polskie kwiaty” nabiera szczególnego znaczenia. Oto jej fragment:

„Śpiewa ci obcy wiatr,
zachwyca wielki świat,
a serce tęskni,
bo gdzieś daleko stąd został rodzinny dom,
tam jest najpiękniej.
Żeby tak jeszcze raz,
ujrzeć ojczysty las,
pola i łąki...
i do matczynych rąk,
przynieść z zielonych łąk,
rozkwitłe pąki...
Bo najpiękniejsze,
są polskie kwiaty,
stokrotki, fiołki...”



Betlejem było miejscem narodzenia Jezusa. Zaś przy wejściu do ruin starożytnego Kafarnaum jest tablica z napisem: „Kafarnaum- miasto Jezusa”. Tu Jezus miał wielu przyjaciół, wiele czasu spędził w tym mieście w okresie publicznej działalności. Tu działał wiele cudów. Jednak rodzinnym miastem Jezusa był Nazaret. Było to miejsce zamieszkania św. Rodziny. Tu żyli krewni i znajomi Jezusa. Przez 30 lat, życie Jezusa było związane z tym miastem.

Święty Hieronim nazywa Nazaret „kwiatem Galilei”. Jest to nawiązanie do słów proroka Izajasza: „wyrośnie różdżka (kwiat) z pnia Jessego”. W rzeczywistości to miasto wygląda jak kolorowy kwiat wyrastający na ziemi galilejskiej. Położone jest na wzgórzach. Barwne domy toną w zieleni kwitnących ogrodów. Do IV wieku Nazaret był czysto żydowskim miastem.

„Porwali się z miejsca, wyrzucili go z miasta”. Co było powodem takiego potraktowania Go przez rodaków? W wyjaśnieniu trzeba się odwołać do obyczajów i kultury ludzi tamtych czasów.

Po pierwsze. W tamtej cywilizacji uważano, że syn powinien iść w ślady ojca; przejąć jego rzemiosło. To była jedna z reguł, jakimi kierowali się ludzie tamtej społeczności. Syn cieśli powinien być cieślą. Wg. tych zasad Jezus powinien przejąć zawód św. Józefa. Jezus zaś naucza jak uczonego w prawie. Podziwiają jego mądrość, ale zgorszeni pytają: „Czyż nie jest to syn Józefa”. A więc, będąc synem cieśli, dlaczego czyni się uczniem w prawie.

Po drugie. W kulturze semickiej bardzo silne były więzy rodzinne. Każdy z członków rodziny na pierwszym miejscu powinien stawiać rodzinę. Mieszkańcy Nazaretu słyszeli, że Jezus dokonał wiele cudów, ale żadnego w ich mieście. Uważali oni, że mają pierwszeństwo do cudów, bo Jezus jest z ich miasta. Dlatego ze złością mówią: „Dokonajże i tu w swojej ojczyźnie tego, co się wydarzyło, jak słyszeliśmy, w Kafarnaum”.

Po trzecie. Chrystus wytknął im błędy. Za to Go znienawidzili, tak jak czasami leniwy uczeń nie lubi swej nauczycielki, tylko dlatego, że jest wymagająca. W efekcie Chrystus został odrzucony przez swoich współziomków. Odrzucając Jezusa, odrzucili możliwość spotkania ze zbawiającym Słowem. I tak dochodzimy do problemu odrzucenia, niedoceniienia w naszym życiu.

Badz zawsze z Chrystusem I Jego Matka.





Święto Ofiarowania Pańskiego jest nawiązaniem do ewangelicznego opisu ofiarowania Jezusa. 40 dni po Jego narodzinach Maryja i Józef zanieśli dzieciątko do świątyni w Jerozolimie, by zgodnie z prawem mojżeszowym ofiarować Je Bogu w hołdzie dziękczynienia za darowanie Izraelitom życia podczas przejścia przez Egipt Anioła Zniszczenia.

My dear friends in Christ,

Imagine that you decided to walk to Mass and as you are walking you run into someone that you see at Mass every week but really don't know all that well. As you make way together to church you begin to talk with this person, you tell your stories and you listen to their stories and before you know it things are different, you are friends! In turn it makes your engagement in the life of the church richer because now you have a new person to walk to church with and someone to say hello to.

My brothers and sisters that is essentially what a synod is and it is what our Holy Father is asking of Catholics around the world to engage in this year. Catholics everywhere are being asked to meet together on the way. Our destination is of course the eternal kingdom established by our Lord, the new heaven and the new earth, the new Jerusalem promised in the Book of Revelation.

The term "synod" comes from two Greek words "syn" meaning meeting and "hodos" meaning way. It is a meeting on the way. Typically, a synod is a gathering in Rome, with the Holy Father picking a specific topic. He summons representatives from all the continents, with laity and clergy alike, subject matter experts, they gather in Rome and have discussions around this topic. Eventually produce a document, a post synodal document.

This time Pope Francis wants to do it much differently, he doesn't want to begin by bringing in just a select representative body, he wants this to be a truly universal gathering, a universal encounter, a universal "meeting on the way." He wants every diocese in the country, and then by extension every parish, every group worldwide, to come together and dialogue, to ask ourselves, what is God asking of us as a church.

The elements of a synod are first, like the walk to Mass, the encounter. Then the next step is to listen to one another, and finally to discern. Helping to guide this important process is Fr. Michael Pierz and our diocesan synod planning team. They are laying the groundwork for this effort and I ask every parish and Catholic organization to lend their support by hosting these synod discussions across our diocese and encouraging all to take part.

The key of this process is listening, that we don't show up with our own agenda, rather we first must listen to what others have to say and share what is on our hearts. The essential quality is this, that the Holy Spirit does not speak to the Pope alone, the Holy Spirit doesn't talk to bishops only, not to priest only or people with religious habits. The Holy Spirit is speaking to each and every single one of us. And so, we have to be able to listen ourselves, to what it is that we desire as church. You are as much of a part of the church as the Pope or me or anyone else.

And by nature of our baptism, we are called fundamentally to be members of that body. But therein lies also a duty with that dignity, its not just the dignity of our baptism, but a duty, to be actively engaged in the life of the church.

The question we are going to ask ourselves is: What is God asking of us? How can we be better? How can we grow according to the yearnings of the Spirit within our lives? This question I pose to you, so that when we gather together, after the New Year, we will have those seeds planted, and the fruits of that question, that desire of the Spirit to speak from us and with us and to listen to what our sisters and brothers have to say. And therein, begin to discern what God is asking of us.

Before we had indication, we were going to have a worldwide Synod, we had already planned a diocesan Year of the Eucharist here, starting in Advent. With the shocking reality that so few Catholics believe in the real presence or ever really knew that Jesus is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

These are not two trains running on different tracks. I believe it is the Holy Spirit working for us and through us. That as we begin to discern, we also have to listen ourselves, to how the Lord is speaking to us.

What more powerful way than to do that, in the presence of Jesus Himself, in the reception of the Eucharist
And so my brothers and sisters I strongly invite you to join me in this synodal process as a great adventure. A great adventure to encounter one another, those we know, and excitingly those we don't yet know, but soon we will be dear friends. Then to begin to listen. Listen to Christ himself speak to us, but also how the Holy Spirit works through our sisters and brothers. And then for us to discern, not just as a universal church, but as a local church, here in western Massachusetts.




World Day for Consecrated Life



SAINT BLAISE
Feast Day: February 3



We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise by Christians around the world than we know about the saint himself. His feast is observed as a holy day in some Eastern Churches. In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise’s feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing for their throats.

We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary Acts of St. Blaise were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise’s cave. They were first surprised and then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears. The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise’s command the child was able to cough up the bone.

Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. The first time Blaise refused, he was beaten. The next time he was suspended from a tree and his flesh torn with iron combs or rakes. Finally, he was beheaded.




