Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good! While my reflections normally center on the Sunday's gospel passage, the words from St. Paul's First Letter to Timothy stood out for me this week: "I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone, for kings and all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity." The death of Queen Elizabeth II has been felt not only in the United Kingdom but also throughout the world. XXV NIEDZIELA ZWYKŁA

Jezus powiedział do swoich uczniów: „Pewien bogaty człowiek miał rządcę, którego oskarżono przed nim, że trwoni jego majątek. Przywołał go do siebie i rzekł mu: «Cóż to słyszę o tobie? Zdadz sprawę z twego zarządu, bo już nie będziesz mógł być rządcą». Na to rządcza rzekł sam do siebie: «Co ja pocznę, skoro mój pan pozbawia mię zarządu? Kopać nie mogę, żebrać się wstydzę. Wiem, co uczynię, żeby mię ludzie przyjęli do swoich domów, gdy będę usunięty z zarządu». Przywołał więc do siebie każdego z dłużników swego pana i zapytał pierwszego: «Ile jesteś winien mojemu panu?» Ten odpowiedział: «Sto beczek oliwy». On mu rzekł: «Weź swoje zobowiązanie, siadaj prędko i napisz pięćdziesiąt». Następnie pytał drugiego: «A ty ile jesteś winien?» Ten odrzekł: «Sto korcy pszenicy». Mówi mu: «Weź swoje zobowiązanie i na-pisz: osiemdziesiąt». Pan pochwalił nieuczciwego rządcę, że roztropnie postąpił. Bo synowie tego świata roztrośniejsi są w stosunkach z ludźmi podobnymi sobie niż synowie światła. Ja także wam powiadam: Zyskujcie sobie przyjaciół nie-godziwą mamoną, aby gdy wszystko się skończy, przyjęto was do wiecznych przybytków. Kto w drobnej rzeczy jest wierny, ten i w wielkiej będzie wierny; a kto w drobnej rzeczy jest nieuczciwy, ten i w wielkiej nieuczciwy będzie. Jeśli więc w zarządzie niegodziwą mamoną nie okazaliście się wierni, prawdziwe dobro kto wam powie-rzy? Jeśli w zarządzie cudzym dobrem nie okazaliście się wierni, kto wam da wasze? Żaden sługa nie może dwom panom służyć. Gdyż albo jed-nego będzie nienawidził, a drugiego miłował; albo z tamtym będzie trzymał, a tym wzgardzi. Nie możecie służyć Bogu i mamonie” (Łk 16, 1-13).



W czasie prześladowania chrześcijan do Polikarpa przybyli żołnierze rzymscy z nakazem aresztowania. Święty biskup przyjął ich życzliwie, proponując im gościnę, dla siebie zaś poprosił o czas na przygotowanie się do męczeńskiej śmierci i spotkania z Chrystusem. Żołnierze usłuchali tej prośby. Święty zaczął się głośno modlić. Żarliwa modlitwa poruszyła twarde serca żołnierzy. Po dwóch godzinach Polikarp był gotowy do podróży. Wsiadł na osła i w eskorcie żołnierzy udał się do Smyrny. Tradycja mówi, że gdy wjeżdżał do miasta zastąpiło mu drogę dwóch senatorów Herod i Nicetas i wzięwszy Biskupa na osobne miejsce zaczęli namawiać go, aby tylko pozornie zapał się Chrystusa i powiedział: cesarzu gotów jestem bogom złożyć ofiarę. I tym sposobem, przez udawane wyznanie wiary w bóstwa pogańskie uratuje swoje życie. Polikarp zdecydowanie odmówił, co więcej starał się nawrócić na wiarę w Chrystusa samych senatorów, czym ich tak zirytował, że zaczęli go lżyć i niezwłocznie odesłali do sądu.

Podczas posiedzenia Sejmu poseł Józef Korpak powiedział: „W czasie dyskusji nad sprawozdaniem Krajowej Rady Radiofonii i Telewizji przewijało się wypowiedziane przez posłów SLD stwierdzenie następującej treści: Tyle kultury, edukacji i wychowania w radiu i telewizji, ile wpływów z abonamentu. W związku z tym stwierdzeniem chciałbym panu przewodniczącemu zadać pytanie: Czy rzeczywiście w telewizji publicznej wartości moralne, upowszechnianie kultury, wychowanie dzieci i młodzieży można i należy przeliczać na brzęczące monety”? Na pewno nie można i nie należy. Jednak w dzisiejszym świecie brzęczące monety zagłuszają głos sumienia, wypaczają miłość, popychają do zdrady i zbrodni, zagłuszają głos Boga i bliźniego w potrzebie. Imię Moneta jest przydomkiem bogini rzymskiej Junony. W świątyni na Kapitolu miała ona swoje miejsce, gdzie bito monety. Stąd też polskie słowo „moneta” wywodzi się od tej bogini, podobnie jak angielskie money (pieniądze). Dla dzisiejszego człowieka pieniądz staje się często boginią, bogiem. Zajmując pierwsze miejsce w życiu staje się źródłem występku. W takim znaczeniu używa Chrystus aramejskiego słowa „mamona” na określenie bogactwa, gdy mówi, że nie możemy służyć Bogu i Mamonie.

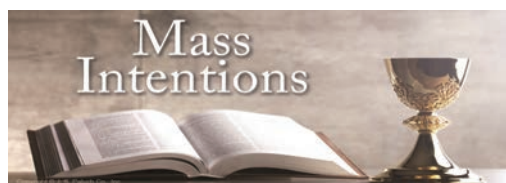

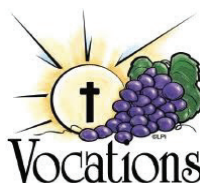
