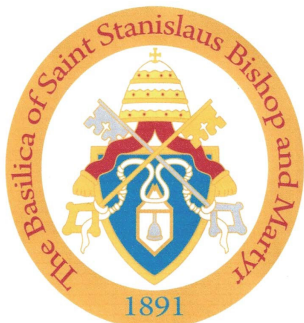

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! Have you ever wondered exactly how prayer “works”? I’m talking specifically about the fourth letter of the acronym ACTS that sums up prayer in all its forms: Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, and **Supplication**. When we ask God for something or pray on behalf of someone, are we trying to change God’s mind? Perhaps that’s not the best way to frame the question. Jesus promised in the Scriptures that perseverance in prayer will have its reward. In other places in the gospels, Jesus affirms that our heavenly Father knows how to give good things to his beloved sons and daughters.

The question is better asked this way: Do we always know what’s best for us? Is prayer of petition even ultimately about us? Ruth Burrows, one of my favorite spiritual writers, puts it this way. We are taught and often assume that prayer is fundamentally about what *we* do, but prayer is about what *God* does in and through us. No doubt God will give us good things, things that we really need. But all prayer serves what Jesus taught us in the Our Father: thy kingdom come. It’s ultimately all about God’s kingdom coming--in us, among us, and through us. St. Augustine had another insight. He wrote that the pouring out of our hearts before God is about expanding our desire *for* God and our capacity to receive divine grace. Persevering in prayer of any kind will bring us more than we ask or imagine.

BIULETYN Parafialny

Po co to wszystko? Po co modlić się wytrwale i nie ustawać? Czemu ma służyć nasza obecność przed Bogiem? Te i podobne pytania pojawiają się, gdy ktoś doświadcza niewysłuchanych prośb czy zawiedzionych nadziei, a jego cierpliwości jest doświadczana ponad miarę. Wtedy warto spojrzeć na biblijnego Mojżesza, który trwał ufnie przed Panem z wzniesionymi do góry rękami, by wyprosić zwycięstwo nad nieprzyjacielskim oddziałem Amalekitów. Kiedy ręce Mojżesza opadały, wtedy przewagę zyskiwali Amalekici.



Modlitwa to nie tylko wypowiedzenie słów, ale przede wszystkim trwanie przy Bogu, nawet wtedy, kiedy wydaje się to beznadziejne. Przeżywając październik winniśmy uświadomić sobie, iż taką cierpliwą, wytrwałą modlitwą jest różaniec. Często w autobusie, w kolejce, czy na łóżku szpitalnym ktoś przesuwając paciorki różańca. Wielu młodych nosi pierścionki z dziesięcioma wypukłościami i używa ich do odmawiania modlitwy różańcowej.

Z jednej strony uderza nas prostota różańca, który dostępna jest dla każdego człowieka. Z drugiej zaś – zachwyca głębia ewangelicznego przesłania, które w sobie niesie. Francuski pisarz i poeta Charles Péguy wyznał na temat różańca: „Przez osiemnaście miesięcy nie byłem w stanie mówić Ojcie nasz... nie potrafiłem zaakceptować Jego woli! Modliłem się więc do Maryi. Modlitwy do Maryi są modlitwami ostateczności. Nie ma żadnej takiej modlitwy w całej liturgii, której najnędniejszy z grzeszników nie mógłby wypowiedzieć w całej prawdzie. W całym mechanizmie zbawienia Zdrowaś Maryjo to ostatni ratunek, którego nie można zatracić. Modlitwa ta odmawiana sercem wzbudza pragnienie, by śpiewać, nie tylko głosem, ale całym życiem, miłość do Dziewicy Maryi”. Każde z tego typu świadectw pokazuje, jak Bóg rzeźbi w sercu człowieka niewidzialne kształty, jak pomaga dojrzewać i nabierać odwagi w podejmowaniu życiowych decyzji.
