Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! Although some movements in our culture have corrupted Halloween for their own questionable or sinister ends, October 31st takes its name from the Christian Feast of All Saints that follows on November 1st. In many places children now dress as their favorite saints and heroes rather than cater to the gruesome. Instead of inspiring fear or terror, All Hallows' Eve is meant to direct our minds and hearts to what is our ultimate destination: eternal life with God, the Blessed Mother, and all the angels and saints.

For most of November, we set our sights on this heavenly homeland as we pray in a special way for all our beloved dead, in the hope that they enjoy this gift of eternal happiness. The Catholic doctrine of purgatory makes eminent sense. It's not a mini hell but a state of purification of all our desires to direct them wholly to God. The analogy of human relationships is helpful here. In kinship or friendship, our love must continually be purified—through better communication, genuine acts of love, sacrifice, and forgiveness when either person is offended. When our human relationships are purged of their self-centeredness, the process can be painful. This is even more true in our relationship with God, who alone is the Holy One. Our lives are ultimately judged against God's holiness and not that of the relative goodness of our fellow human beings. For eternal life to be one of reward and blessedness, our love must be purified of all that is not of God, all that is not holy. If this growth process doesn't conclude during our lives on earth, our Catholic faith teaches that it continues into eternity.

As we commend our loved ones to the perfect justice, mercy, and love of God, we also pray that our lives each day may reflect more and more the holiness of the loving Father who calls us to enjoy even now the fullness of mercy and love through our relationship with Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. A blessed month of November to you!

BIULETYN Parafialny

Szybkie zmiany w codziennej rzeczywistość, do których trudno się dostosować, sprawia, że nieustannie za czymś gonimy. Boimy się zatrzymać, aby inni nas nie wyprzedzili, bo wtedy odpadniemy w rywalizacji. Boimy się stracić to, co udało nam się od życia wyrzapać. Jesteśmy jak worki bez dna, bez względu na to ile włożymy i tak będzie mało. Dlaczego? Bo człowiek jest z natury istotą poszukującą.



Jednego z takich poszukujących możemy zobaczyć w dzisiejszej Ewangelii. To Zacheusz człowiek bardzo bogatego. Jako zwierzchnik celników zatrudniał na podległym mu terenie poborców i ustalał wysokość cła za sprzedawane towary. Z jednej strony jego stanowisko zapewniało mu pokaźny dochód, z drugiej – było przyczyną nienawiści ze strony ludu. Mimo iż Zacheusz był daleki duchowo od Jezusa, pragnął jednak Go zobaczyć. W tym celu wspina się na sykomorę, by nie przeoczyć momentu przejścia Jezusa. Ewangelista Łukasz ukazuje to spotkanie, by zwrócić naszą uwagę na sens posłannictwa Bożego Syna. Jest nim odnalezienie tych, którzy pogubili się na życiowych ścieżkach, a przez ludzi zostali odepchnięci i skazani na potępienie.

Postawa Zacheusza bardzo dobitnie wskazuje na fakt, że spotkanie z Jezusem może zmienić dotychczasowe życie, nawet człowiek, który po ludzku znajduje się na pozycji przegranej. Znakiem rozpoczęcia przez Zacheusza nowego życia jest chęć naprawienia wyrządzonych wcześniej krzywd. Zacheusz nie musiał, lecz chciał dać połowę majątku na rzecz potrzebujących. Również nie musiał zwracać aż tak wiele tym, których okradł. Ale zrobił to, ponieważ spotkał Zbawiciela. Nie była to więc tylko pusta deklaracja, skoro Jezus mówi w odpowiedzi: „Dziś zbawienie stało się udziałem tego domu”. Postawa Zacheusza tak poruszyła jego rodzinę, że wszyscy przyjęli zbawienie Boże przez wiarę w Jezusa. W odróżnieniu od bogatego młodzieńca przeżywa radość, ponieważ spotkanie zmieniło jego sposób patrzenia na życie i było momentem objawienia wewnętrznej wolności w stosunku do posiadanego majątku.

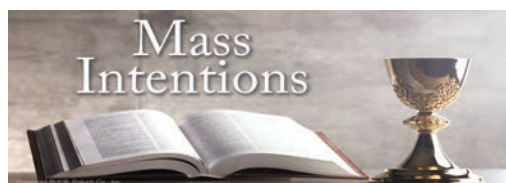

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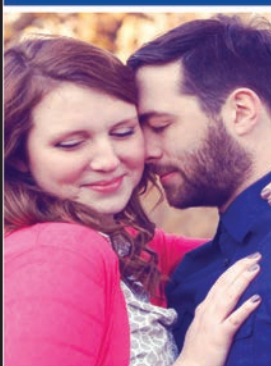
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
