

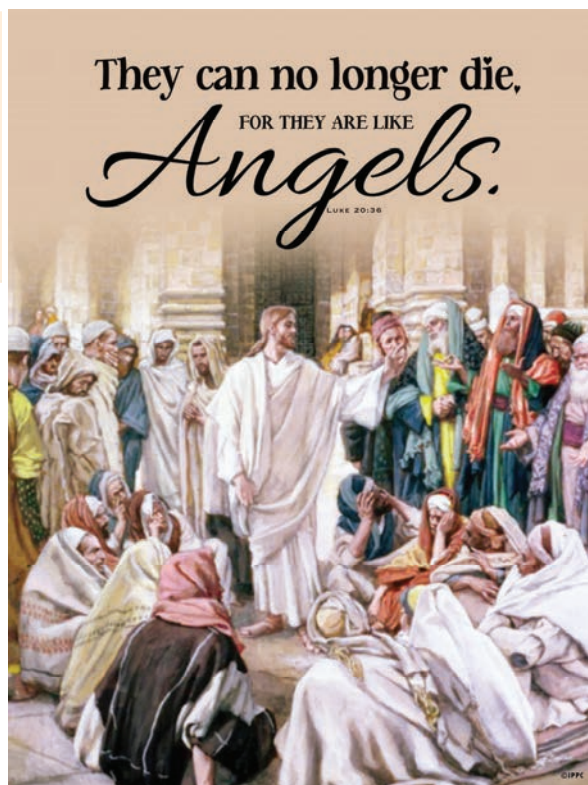

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and all good things! As the midterm elections approach, social media and the press have emotions running high. I can recall few times in my life when non-presidential elections generated this much excitement. While it's not my place to tell you how you should vote, Catholics who are serious about their faith and commitment to Jesus Christ can no longer pretend that we have many options. Politics used to be more about genuine compromise and generous amounts of politicians' good will, despite being on opposing sides of issues.

With the moral fabric of America unraveling, the common Judeo-Christian foundation upon which to base legitimate compromise becomes less and less acknowledged or even well-known. Even many Catholics, presumably of good will, fall back to the precarious position of how they "feel" about certain issues that are already definitive in Church teaching or the natural law, which is available through right reasoning to all people of whatever faith or no faith, e.g., abortion and other life issues. Right reason goes deeper than mere feelings about an issue and depends on our knowledge of the facts, the tried-and-true wisdom of our tradition, and the regular practice of faith for people of faith.

For important guidance as you head to the voting booth on Election Day, pray hard, check out the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, and visit FaithfulCitizenship.org, part of the website of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops. May the Lord bless us and guide us as we exercise our rights and responsibilities as citizens of the USA.

BIULETYN Parafialny

Troska o życie wieczne odgrywa w życiu dzisiejszego człowieka rolę drugorzędną, a niekiedy jest uważana za coś wprost staromodnego, a zatem i wstydliwego. Karl Rahner, wybitny teolog i uważny obserwator świadomości religijnej ludzi XX wieku, zauważa ciekawą prawidłowość: „Są chrześcijanie, którzy są pewni istnienia Boga (...), ale nie uważają za konieczne, by troszczyć się w jakiś szczególny sposób o kwestię życia wiecznego”. Wielu ludzi próbuje też przykładać ziemską miarę, by oceniać rzeczywistość nadprzyrodzoną. A ta rzeczywistość okazuje się jakże różna od naszych wyobrażeń.



Na tym samym polegał błąd saduceuszów z dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Przykład o siedmiu mężach jednej żony miał być dowodem przeciwko zmartwychwstaniu i życiu wiecznemu, w które saduceusze nie wierzyli. Jezus udziela im jednak odpowiedzi na trapiące ich wątpliwości, z którymi sami nie są sobie w stanie poradzić. Ci, którzy zostaną uznani za godnych udziału w świecie przyszłym, „ani się żenić nie będą, ani za mąż wychodzić”.

W myśleniu o rzeczach ostatecznych, jak niebo, piekło, czyściec czy oglądanie Boga twarzą w twarz trudno nie uciekać się do wyobraźni. Bo przecież „ani oko nie widziało, ani ucho nie słyszało, jak wielkie rzeczy przygotował Bóg tym, którzy Go miłują”. Zatem nasze poszukiwania życia wiecznego to wyraz odwagi wiary, która poważnie traktuje zachęty do odkrywania Boga jako pełni szczęścia. Dzieje się to zgodnie z pragnieniem, które Bóg zapisał w ludzkim sercu. Obrazuje to historia prześladowań rodu Machabeuszów, męczeństwo braci w obronie wiary i wierności Bogu i Jego przykazaniom staje się obrazem bohaterstwa naszych przodków. Determinacja i odwaga udręczonych braci oraz pewność, że są w rękach Stwórcy dają im ogromną siłę znoszenia największych męczarni. Wobec oprawców przyjmują postawę pełną godności. Gdy zbliża się koniec życia, powierzają się Bogu zdążając przez śmierć męczeńską do niebieskiej ojczyzny. W Bogu pokładają swoją nadzieję, mając świadomość, że „Król świata jednak [tych], którzy umieramy za Jego prawa, wskrzesi i ożywi do życia wiecznego”.

2023 MASS BOOK - The Mass Book is now open for reserving Mass Intentions for 2023. We understand the desire to have a number of Masses offered for the same person or persons, but the result is that many parishioners are left with few options that may be many months away. In the best interests of the parish as a whole, Mass intentions will be limited to three (3) reserved dates per family initially (1 weekend Mass and 2 weekday Masses). After a few months this restriction will be lifted within reasonable limits.

Due to the state legislation regarding patients' rights and healthcare privacy, **hospitals are no longer permitted to give out the names and religious preferences of their patients without the explicit request of the patient or their family.**

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL UPDATE (as of October 25) - \$2,724,286 has been donated or pledged to the Annual Catholic Appeal. That amount is still down \$77,603.76 from this date in 2021, but we've gained +\$41,000 in a week's time! 15,507 donors have contributed. That number is down 1,937 donors from this point in 2021. The average donation is going lower as the number of donors increases (\$176.00). To reach \$3,000,000, we have to raise \$275,714 by December 24. Thank you for your generosity! *This year, St. Stan's raised only \$36,002.33, 56% of last year's amount (\$66,676.99). O Father, you desire all of us to be happy.

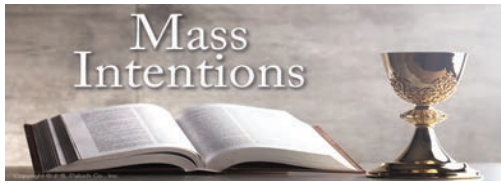
Stir up the grace of a religious vocation in the hearts of many men and women.

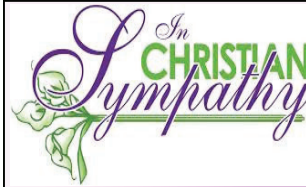

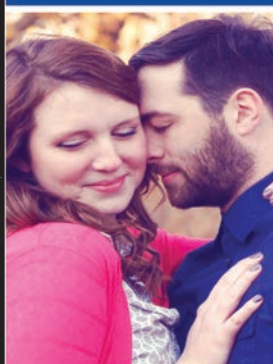
